BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 260, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By amending subsection (a) of section 2 to read: 4 "(a) There is established the Hawaii anti-trafficking task 5 force.
