A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the personal use of 2 fireworks in the State is a serious threat to our community's 3 health, safety, and welfare. 4 While the legislature recognizes the popularity of 5 fireworks in Hawaii and the cultural and historical significance 6 to the people of the State, including New Year's, Chinese New 7 year's, and the Fourth of July celebrations, the legislature 8 nevertheless finds that the costs of fireworks to society 9 greatly outweigh any benefits derived from its continued 10 legalization, at least in more densely crowded areas. 11 The purpose of this Act is to ban all fireworks in counties 12 with a population of more than five hundred thousand persons. 13 SECTION 2. Section 132D-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 "§132D-5 General prohibitions. (a) It shall be unlawful 16 for any person without a permit to:
- 17 (1) Remove or extract the pyrotechnic contents from any fireworks;

- 6 fireworks, aerial devices, consumer fireworks, articles
- 7 pyrotechnic, or display fireworks in a county with a population
- 8 of more than five hundred thousand persons.
- 9 Any person violating this subsection shall be guilty of a
- 10 class C felony."
- 11 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
