### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ALTERNATIVE MEDICINE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In 2000, the legislature found that modern
- 2 medical research had discovered a beneficial use for marijuana
- 3 in treating or alleviating the pain or other symptoms associated
- 4 with certain debilitating illnesses, but also recognized the
- 5 need to regulate such use, for the health and welfare of our
- 6 citizens. As a result, regulation of the medical use of
- 7 marijuana was enacted into law in 2000 in Act 228, Session Laws
- 8 of Hawaii 2000, and codified in part IX, chapter 329, Hawaii
- 9 Revised Statutes (HRS).
- 10 In its mission statement, the Food and Drug Administration
- 11 (FDA) declares that its goal is to speed along innovations that
- 12 make foods and medicines more effective, safer, and more
- 13 affordable. However, the FDA does not seem to have offered much
- 14 information on the use of medical marijuana to improve our
- 15 health. As a result, states have taken the initiative to find
- 16 evidence to support the proposition that certain diseases and
- 17 conditions may respond favorably to medically-controlled use of
- 18 marijuana.

- 1 The legislature finds that further research on the medical
- 2 efficacy of marijuana is in the best interests of the state and
- 3 the state's medical marijuana patients.
- 4 Marijuana is currently classified as a schedule I
- controlled substance pursuant to section 329-14, HRS, which is a 5
- 6 category designated for substances that have no medical value.
- 7 This neither reflects the results of scientific research, past
- 8 legislative action, nor the medical marijuana laws in at least
- 9 eleven other states, and the legislature finds that it may be
- 10 worth considering changing its classification to a schedule III
- controlled substance. 11
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 13 University of Hawaii to study the medical efficacy of marijuana
- in its various forms of delivery, including the reclassification 14
- of medical marijuana as a schedule III controlled substance. 15
- 16 SECTION 2. The University of Hawaii shall perform a study
- on the medical efficacy of marijuana in its various forms of 17
- 18 delivery, including the reclassification of medical marijuana as
- a schedule III controlled substance. 19
- 20 The various forms of delivery of medical marijuana to be
- 21 studied shall include: vaporizing, sublingual tinctures,
- 22 topical ointments, edibles, and smoking.

- 2 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
- 3 legislation, to the legislature no more than twenty days prior
- 4 to the convening of the regular session of 2009.
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for a
- 8 study on the medical efficacy of marijuana pursuant to section 2
- 9 of this Act.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 11 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
