A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. For years, the State has granted permits for 2 recreational-residences in the Koke'e and Waimea canyon state 3 parks. Currently, there are approximately one hundred forty recreational-residence use leases in Koke'e and Waimea canyon 4 state parks. The board of land and natural resources has 5 6 directed the department of land and natural resources to conduct a public auction of all of its recreation-residence use leases 7 in Koke'e and Waimea canyon state parks following their 8 9 expiration in December 2006. Many of the existing lessees have made substantial improvements on their leased lots, some having 10 11 done so over a period of generations, and they do not want to 12 abandon these improvements. The issue of a public auction became contentious enough that a recent decision was made to 13 14 delay the auction indefinitely, pending the conclusion of 15 lawsuits and public input. The decision resulted in the State 16 issuing month-to-month tenancy of the recreational residences to 17 the lessees. However, the uncertainty of the leaseholders' length of tenancy has led to the deferral of maintenance on the 18

- 1 recreational cabins, many of which are historic and an
- 2 irreplaceable part of the cultural landscape of the Koke'e and
- 3 Waimea canyon state parks.
- 4 The legislature further finds that, for the good of the
- 5 cabins and the Koke'e and the Waimea canyon state parks, the
- 6 leaseholders of recreational-residential use leases must be
- 7 provided with the long-term assurance that they need to invest
- 8 in maintenance and repair of the properties.
- 9 SECTION 2. The department of land and natural resources
- 10 shall extend its recreational-residence use leases in the Koke'e
- 11 and Waimea canyon state parks for five years at a per cent
- 12 increase.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 14 and shall be repealed on January 1, 2012.
