A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The le	gislature finds that the report of the	
2	online learning task fo	rce established by Act 275, Session Laws	
3	of Hawaii 2007, provides a plan to the department of education		
4	for expanding online learning opportunities for students across		
5	the State. Online learning is a strategic vehicle that will		
6	define the department as a $21^{\rm st}$ century learning institution.		
7	The purpose of this Act is to direct the department of		
8	education to adopt and implement recommendations and strategic		
9	goals contained in the task force's report.		
10	SECTION 2. The department of education shall adopt the		
11	following recommendation	ns of the online learning task force to:	
12	(1) Follow a two-	pronged delivery model of services and	
13	continue to o	perate the Myron B. Thompson full-time	
14	cyber academy	as a charter school, as well as	
15	establish a Ha	awaii virtual learning network for	
16	supplemental p	programs;	
17	(2) Establish a ta	ask force to review the State's education	

policies, requirements, and oversight functions for

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1		congruency with the needs and potential of online
2		learning;
3	(3)	Allow both parents and students to access information
4		about online curriculum;
5	(4)	Develop and establish a mentoring and training program
6		for online teachers, collaborating with the University
7		of Hawaii department of educational technology as
8		needed;
9	(5)	Develop and establish an online training program to
10		increase the number of highly qualified teachers,
11		administrators, and paraprofessionals;
12	(6)	Provide support and incentives to teachers who become
13		qualified to teach online courses and for teachers who
14		utilize online courses to incorporate project-based
15		and work-relevant learning;
16	(7)	Standardize the procedure for granting credits for
17		online coursework;
18	(8)	Assist schools with online standards-based college
19		preparatory curriculum;
20	(9)	Expand credit recovery courses and remediation
21		courses;

1	(10)	Emphasize online science, technology, engineering, and	
2		mathematics courses and aggressively work to offer	
3		certain online courses through the department,	
4		including algebra I, English I, eighth-grade math and	
5		English, and career guidance;	
6	(11)	Expand distance education through interactive digital	
7		television;	
8	(12)	Establish an online course and resource center to	
9		include training modules and other support resources;	
10	(13)	Establish online and in-person tutoring and mentoring	
11		programs for students, partnering with the University	
12		of Hawaii as needed; and	
13	(14)	Develop recommendations on appropriate funding	
14		mechanisms.	
15	The a	above recommendations shall be implemented by the	
16	department in consultation with the full task force		
17	recommendations. The department shall systematically establish		
18	the infrastructure for online learning based on institution		
19	type, in the following order of priority: high schools		
20	(including charter high schools), middle and elementary schools		
21	adult community schools, charter middle and elementary schools,		
22	the University of Hawaii system (particularly the community		

- 1 colleges), private secondary and post-secondary institutions
- 2 (for a fee), and adult populations for remedial education and
- 3 upgrading of workforce skill.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
