A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 2007, the 2 legislature adopted Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 56, S.D. 1, 3 which requested the Hawaii educational policy center to report on the retention and change in assignment of teachers within the 4 5 department of education. Pursuant to its study, the Hawaii 6 educational policy center made several findings and recommendations to the legislature, including that the 7 8 information necessary to develop a teacher workforce strategic 9 plan, as requested in the resolution, is currently unavailable 10 because sufficient data has not been collected annually and 11 consistently from all stakeholders.

12 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii educational 13 policy center recommended that the legislature convene a teacher 14 workforce strategic planning committee to develop, adopt, adapt, 15 track, and evaluate the implementation of a strategic teacher 16 workforce development plan for the State.

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The purpose of this Act is to establish the teacher				
workforce strategic planning committee and provide funding				
therefor.				
SECTION 2. (a) There is established the teacher workforce				
strategic planning committee within the University of Hawaii.				
The teacher education coordinating committee shall provide				
administrative, technical, and clerical support to the				
committee.				
(b)	The teacher workforce strategic planning committee			
shall consist of nine members, without regard to section 26-34,				
Hawaii Revised Statutes, as follows:				
(1)	The superintendent of education or the

(3)	One representative from the University of Hawaii at

14	expenses,	incurred in the performance of their duties under this			
15	Act. Any	member of the task force shall be immune from civil			
16	liability	, as provided for under section 26-35.5, Hawaii Revised

18	(d)	The teacher workforce strategic planning committee

20	(1)	Develop, adopt, adapt, track, and evaluate the			
21		implementation of a strategic teacher workforce

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1 (2)Develop an affordable, easily implemented, multi-2 agency teacher data system to identify and track 3 teacher candidates through the educational, 4 employment, and professional development pipeline. The system should collect timely and ongoing data to 5 6 assist policymakers in making decisions and in 7 identifying important trends or patterns that inform 8 and improve targeted teacher recruitment, hiring, 9 retention, professional support and development, and 10 premature retirement or departure rates. The system 11 should also contemplate the need for the transfer of 12 appropriate data, with protocols to protect individual 13 privacy; and 14 Conduct research on the development and implementation (3)

15 of detailed entrance and exit surveys from 16 institutions of higher education that match student 17 and employee dispositions and experiences with the 18 size, type, and culture of the school to which they 19 were assigned. Research should also focus on why 20 teachers decide to enter the workforce, reasons for 21 transferring from school to school, and factors 22 influencing teachers to leave teaching.



1 The teacher workforce strategic planning committee (e) 2 shall submit its findings and recommendations, including 3 proposed legislation, if necessary, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session 4 of 2009. 5

6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for 9 the teacher workforce strategic planning committee established 10 pursuant to this Act.

11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act. 12

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008, and 13 14 shall be repealed on June 30, 2009.
