### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The federal Sex Offender Registration and 2 Notification Act is Title I of the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Public Safety Act of 2006, Public Law No. 248-109, ("the 3 4 Act"). The Act requires the fifty states, the District of 5 Columbia, the five principal United States territories, and federally recognized Indian tribes that function as sex offender 6 7 registration jurisdictions to conform their laws to guidelines 8 for sex offender registration adopted by the Department of 9 Justice by July 29, 2009. Failing substantial compliance with 10 the guidelines, a jurisdiction faces the loss of ten per cent of 11 any federal funds it may receive pursuant to the Edward Byrne 12 Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program. 13 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the Adam Walsh Act 14 compliance working group. The working group shall be comprised of the following: 15 16 The attorney general; (1)

- (e) The Adam Walsh Act compliance working group shallcease to exist after June 30, 2009.
