A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 134-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:
3	"(c) This section shall not apply to law enforcement
4	officers of county police and sheriff departments of this
5	[State, state, and conservation and resources enforcement
6	officers duly authorized under chapter 199, or vendors providing
7	electric guns to those entities; provided that electric guns
8	shall at all times remain in the custody and control of the
9	county police or sheriff departments [-] or the conservation and
10	resources enforcement program of the department of land and
11	natural resources.
12	(d) The county police and sheriff departments of this
13	[State] state, and the conservation and resources enforcement
14	program of the department of land and natural resources shall
15	maintain records regarding every electric gun in their custody
16	and control. [Such] The records shall report every instance of
17	usage of the electric guns; in particular, records shall be
18	maintained in a similar manner as for those of discharging of HB3016 HD1 HMS 2008-1887

1	firearms. The county police and sheriff departments, and the
2	conservation and resources enforcement program shall annually
3	report to the legislature regarding these records twenty days
4	before the beginning of each session."
5	SECTION 2. The conservation and resources enforcement
6	program of the department of land and natural resources shall
7	pursue law enforcement accreditation or recognition from a
8	nationally recognized law enforcement accreditation or
9	credentialing program in the use of electronic guns prior to
10	purchasing electric guns and related equipment and obtaining
11	training for the use of the electric guns.
12	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much
14	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for:
15	(1) The pursuit of law enforcement accreditation or
16	recognition from a nationally recognized law
17	enforcement accreditation or credentialing program in
18	the use of electronic guns; and
19	(2) The purchase of electric guns, related equipment, and
20	training in their use for conservation and resources
21	enforcement officers.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008;
- 6 provided that section 1 shall not take effect until the
- 7 conservation and resources enforcement program of the department
- 8 of land and natural resources receives accreditation or
- 9 recognition from a nationally recognized law enforcement
- 10 accreditation or credentialing program; provided further that
- 11 this Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2010, and section 134-16,
- 12 Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which
- 13 it read on the day prior to the effective date of this Act, in
- 14 the event the division has not obtained the required
- 15 accreditation or recognition by that date.
