RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| SECTION 1. Section 134-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is |

| amended by amending subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows: |
| "(c) This section shall not apply to law enforcement |
| officers of county police and sheriff departments of this State, |
| and enforcement officers of the conservation and resources |
| enforcement program under chapter 199, or vendors providing |

| shall at all times remain in the custody and control of the |
| county police or sheriff departments $[\cdot, \cdot]$ or the conservation and |

| (d) The county police and sheriff departments of this |
| State, and the conservation and resources enforcement program of |
| the department of land and natural resources shall maintain |
| records regarding every electric gun in their custody and |
| control. [Such] The records shall report every instance of |
| usage of the electric guns; in particular, records shall be |
| maintained in a similar manner as for those of discharging of |

- 1 firearms. The county police and sheriff departments and the

- 5 SECTION 2. The conservation and resources enforcement
- 6 program of the department of land and natural resources shall
- 7 pursue law enforcement accreditation or recognition from a
- 8 nationally recognized law enforcement accreditation or
- 9 credentialing program in the use of electric guns prior to
- 10 purchasing electric guns and related equipment and obtaining
- 11 training for the use of the electric guns.
- 12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for:
- 15 (1) The pursuit of law enforcement accreditation or
- 16 recognition from a nationally recognized law
- 17 enforcement accreditation or credentialing program in
- 18 the use of electric guns by conservation and resources
- 19 enforcement officers; and
- 20 (2) The purchase of electric guns, related equipment, and
- training in their use for conservation and resources
- 22 enforcement officers.
