A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 134-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by amending subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:			
3	"(c) This section shall not apply to law enforcement			
4	officers of county police and sheriff departments of this State			
5	and enforcement officers of the conservation and resources			
6	enforcement program under chapter 199, or vendors providing			
7	electric guns to those entities; provided that electric guns			
8	shall at all times remain in the custody and control of the			
9	county police or sheriff departments $[\div]$ or the conservation and			
10	resources enforcement program of the department of land and			
11	natural resources.			
12	(d) The county police and sheriff departments of this			
13	State, and the conservation and resources enforcement program of			
14	the department of land and natural resources shall maintain			
15	records regarding every electric gun in their custody and			
16	control. [Such] The records shall report every instance of			
17	usage of the electric guns; in particular, records shall be			
18	maintained in a similar manner as for those of discharging of			
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1	firearms. The county police and sheriff departments and the			
2	conservation and resources enforcement program shall annually			
3	report to the legislature regarding these records twenty days			
4	before the beginning of each session."			
5	SECTION 2. The conservation and resources enforcement			
6	program of the department of land and natural resources shall			
7	pursue law enforcement accreditation or recognition from a			
8	nationally recognized law enforcement accreditation or			
9	credentialing program in the use of electric guns prior to			
10	purchasing electric guns and related equipment and obtaining			
11	training for the use of the electric guns.			
12	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general			
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much			
14	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for:			
15	(1) The pursuit of law enforcement accreditation or			
16	recognition from a nationally recognized law			
17	enforcement accreditation or credentialing program in			
18	the use of electric guns by conservation and resources			
19	enforcement officers; and			
20	(2) The purchase of electric guns, related equipment, and			
21	training in their use for conservation and resources			
22	enforcement officers.			

1	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
2	land and	natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
3	SECT	ION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
6	provided	that:
7	(1)	Section 1 shall not take effect until the conservation
8		and resources enforcement program of the department of
9		land and natural resources receives accreditation or
10		recognition from a nationally recognized law
11		enforcement accreditation or credentialing program;
12		and
13	(2)	This Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2010, and
14		section 134-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be
15		reenacted in the form in which it read on the day
16		prior to the effective date of this Act, if the
17		conservation and resources enforcement program of the
18		department of land and natural resources does not
19		obtain the required accreditation or recognition by
20		that date.
