RELATING TO THE LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS APPEALS BOARD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to authorize the
- 2 labor and industrial relations appeals board to employ a
- 3 hearings officer. Enabling language regarding a hearings
- 4 officer in this statute would allow the board to expedite
- 5 hearings on workers' compensation treatment plan issues,
- 6 vocational rehabilitation issues, and temporary total disability
- 7 issues. The hearings officer would hear these issues and
- 8 propose a decision and order for review and approval by the full
- 9 Board. This would afford expedited resolution of time-sensitive
- 10 matters appealed from decisions of the director of labor and
- 11 industrial relations to the board.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 371-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
- "(f) The chairperson of the appeal board shall be
- 15 responsible for the administrative functions of the appeal

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS APPEALS BOARD.

PURPOSE:

To authorize the Labor and Industrial Relations Appeals Board ("Board") to employ a hearings officer in order for the Board to expedite hearings on certain workers' compensation matters. The hearings officer would hear certain types of appeals and propose a decision and order for review and approval by the full board. This would allow for expedited resolution of those

appeals.

MEANS:

Amend Section 371-4(f), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Certain issues appealed from decisions of the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations to the Board, including workers' compensation treatment plan issues, vocational rehabilitation issues, and temporary total disability issues are timesensitive. Expediting decision making on such appeals can be achieved through fast-tracking these particular appeals through a hearings officer trained, employed, and directed by the chair and members of the Board. A proposed decision and order prepared by the hearings officer would then be reviewed and approved by the Board.

Impact on the public: Faster adjudication of time sensitive issues on appeal from the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations will bring quicker resolution to injured workers and employers.

Impact on the department and other agencies: The additional hearings officer will allow



the Board to reduce the case load of pending

appeals.
