# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CLOTHESLINES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that electric clothes 2 dryers use over ten per cent of many households' total energy 3 demand. Reducing the use of clothes dryers in the state could 4 substantially decrease the amount of electricity that households 5 use, and thereby reduce the amount of fossil fuels used to generate electricity. 6 The legislature further finds that simple clotheslines make 7 8 efficient use of two abundant resources, sun and wind, to dry 9 clothing. For aesthetic reasons, however, many homeowners 10 associations prohibit or limit the use of clotheslines to dry 11 clothes by association member homeowners. The legislature 12 further finds that, while aesthetic concerns may have been acceptable 20 years ago, it makes no sense today to restrict 13 14 smart energy-saving behavior given Hawaii's high energy costs, overdependence of fossil fuels, and climate change issues. 15 16 The purpose of this Act is to allow the use of clotheslines

on any privately owned single-family residential dwelling or

## H.B. NO. 3211 H.D. 2

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 196-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 "\$196-7 Placement of solar energy devices[-] and
- 5 clotheslines. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, no
- 6 person shall be prevented by any covenant, declaration, bylaws,
- 7 restriction, deed, lease, term, provision, condition, codicil,
- 8 contract, or similar binding agreement, however worded, from
- 9 installing a solar energy device on any single-family
- 10 residential dwelling or townhouse that the person owns [-] , or
- 11 installing and using a clothesline for the purpose of drying
- 12 clothes on the premises of any single-family residential
- 13 dwelling or townhouse that the person owns; provided that rules
- 14 that facilitate the placement of clotheslines shall not be
- 15 unduly or unreasonably restrictive. Any provision in any lease,
- 16 instrument, or contract contrary to the intent of this section
- 17 shall be void and unenforceable."
- 18 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Solar Energy; Clotheslines
