A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the purposes of Act
- 2 115, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, include clarifying the
- 3 significant role of the board of education in policymaking for
- 4 charter schools and delegating certain responsibilities,
- 5 including charter school authorization and oversight, to the
- 6 charter school review panel. Act 115 also states that it was
- 7 not the legislature's intent that Act 115 alter or affect the
- 8 board of education's role as the state education agency for the
- 9 State. The legislature further finds that article x, section 3
- 10 of the state constitution provides that the board of education
- 11 shall have the power, as provided by law, to formulate statewide
- 12 educational policy.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to make clarifying amendments to
- 14 laws affecting the charter schools.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 17 "(d) The board shall appoint the charter school review



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    schools, with the power and duty to issue charters, oversee and
    monitor charter schools, hold charter schools accountable for
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    their performance, and revoke charters. The board shall also
