A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend Act 56,
2	Session L	aws of Hawaii 2007, which established a candidate
3	advisory	council for the board of regents (board) of the
4	Universit	y of Hawaii in conformity with the amendment to article
5	X, sectio	n 6 of the Hawaii Constitution, ratified by the voters
6	on Novemb	er 7, 2006. Specifically, this Act:
7	(1)	Clarifies that the name of the candidate advisory
8		council is the "regents candidate advisory council"
9		(council);
10	(2)	Requires a board member, except the student member, to
11		reside in the geographic area represented by the
12		member;
13	(3)	Requires the governor to notify the council in writing
14		of vacancies on the board within ten days of receiving
15		notification that a board member is resigning or has
16		died, or of removal by the governor;

1	(4)	Requires the submission of candidates within 60 days
2		of a vacancy on the board that arises by resignation,
3		death, or removal by the governor;
4	(5)	Clarifies that the council is to submit the names of
5		candidates to the governor;
6	(6)	Makes confidential information concerning potential
7		candidates that is not of public record; provided that
8		information relating to a candidate who is appointed
9		by the governor shall be disclosed; and
10	(7)	Appropriates funds to establish a permanent
11		administrative position for the council.
12	SECT	ION 2. Section 26-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
14	"(a)	The University of Hawaii shall be headed by an
15	executive	board to be known as the board of regents.
16	The l	ooard shall consist of fifteen members. At least one
17	member sha	all be a University of Hawaii student at the time of
18	the initia	al appointment. This member may be reappointed for one
19	additional	l term even though the member may no longer be a
20	student at	the time of reappointment. The governor shall reduce
21	the terms	of those initially appointed to each seat on the board
22	of regents	s to provide, as far as practicable, for the expiration

- 1 of three terms each year; provided that the term of the student
- 2 member shall not be reduced.
- 3 At least twelve members, except for the student member,
- 4 shall represent and reside in the specified geographic areas as
- 5 follows:
- 6 (1) Two members from the county of Hawaii;
- 7 (2) Two members from the county of Maui;
- 8 (3) One member from the county of Kauai; and
- 9 (4) Seven members from the city and county of Honolulu.
- 10 The board shall have the power, in accordance with the
- 11 [Constitution of the State] Hawaii Constitution and with law, to
- 12 formulate policy and to exercise control over the university
- 13 through its executive officer, the president of the university.
- 14 The board shall have exclusive jurisdiction over the internal
- 15 organization and management of the university."
- 16 SECTION 3. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 19 meetings. (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the
- 20 general management and control of the board of regents
- 21 consisting of fifteen members who shall be appointed and may be
- 22 removed by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by law,

- 1 state officers shall be eligible for appointment and membership.
- 2 The term of each member shall be five years, except as provided
- 3 for the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided that the
- 4 term of the student member shall be two years. Every member may
- 5 serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term of
- 6 appointment until the member's successor has been appointed by
- 7 the governor and confirmed by the senate in accordance with
- 8 article X, section 6 of the [state constitution.] Hawaii
- 9 Constitution. Members shall serve no more than two consecutive
- 10 five-year terms; provided that the members who are initially
- 11 appointed to terms of two years or less pursuant to section 26-
- 12 11(a) may be reappointed to two ensuing five-year terms. If a
- 13 member is to be appointed to a second term of five years, the
- 14 senate shall consider the question of whether to reconfirm the
- 15 member at least one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion
- 16 of a member's first five-year term; provided that if the senate
- 17 is not in session within one hundred twenty days prior to the
- 18 conclusion of the member's first five-year term, the member
- 19 shall continue to serve until the senate convenes for the next
- 20 regular session or the next special session for which the senate
- 21 is authorized to consider the question of reconfirmation.

- 1 (b) At its first meeting after June 30, the board of 2 regents shall elect a chairperson and vice-chairperson, who shall serve until adjournment of its first meeting after June 30 3 of the next year or thereafter until their successors are 4 appointed. The board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not 5 6 be a member of the board. The president of the university shall act as executive officer of the board. From May 1, 2007, and 7 until such time that the board of regents has at least fourteen 8 members, seven members of the board of regents shall constitute 9 10 a quorum to conduct business, and the concurrence of at least seven members of the board of regents shall be necessary to make 11 12 any action of the board of regents valid; provided that upon 13 filling at least fourteen of the fifteen board of regents seats required under subsection (a), a majority of the board of 14 15 regents shall constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the 16 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board 17 of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten 18 19 times annually and, from time to time, may meet in each of the
- (c) The governor shall notify the regents candidateadvisory council in writing of the resignation, death, or

counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.

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- 1 removal of a member of the board of regents within ten days of
- 2 the removal or of the receipt of notification of the resignation
- 3 or death of the member.
- 4 [(c)] (d) The members of the board of regents shall serve
- 5 without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses
- 6 within the [State] state when attending meetings of the board or
- 7 when actually engaged in business relating to the work of the
- 8 board."
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 304A-104.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "[+]§304A-104.5[] Candidate] Regents candidate advisory
- 12 council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii.
- 13 (a) There is established the regents candidate advisory council
- 14 for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to present
- 15 to the governor pools of qualified candidates from which the
- 16 members of the board of regents shall be nominated and, by and
- 17 with the consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. The
- 18 regents candidate advisory council shall establish the criteria
- 19 for qualifying, screening, and presenting to the governor
- 20 candidates for membership on the board of regents. The regents
- 21 candidate advisory council shall be attached to the University
- 22 of Hawaii for administrative purposes.



1	(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), within sixty
2	days of convening its first meeting, the regents candidate
3	advisory council shall present no fewer than two and no more
4	than four qualified candidates to the governor for each vacant
5	seat on the board of regents that has arisen due to resignation,
6	death, or removal by the governor; provided that for all
7	subsequent presentations to the governor, the regents candidate
8	advisory council shall present no fewer than two and no more
9	than four candidates for each seat on the board of regents to
10	the governor within:
11	(1) [Thirty] Sixty days of a vacancy that arises by
12	resignation, death, or removal by the governor; or
13	(2) One hundred twenty days prior to the expiration of a
14	term.
15	(c) When there are multiple seats vacant within the same
16	county or within the at-large membership, the <u>regents</u> candidate
17	advisory council shall present candidates for seats on the board
18	of regents to the governor as follows:
19	(1) For two seats from the same county or two at-large
20	seats, no fewer than four and no more than six
21	candidates;

	(2)	For three seats from the same country, no rewer than
2		five and no more than eight candidates; and
3	(3)	For more than three seats, the <u>regents</u> candidate
4		advisory council shall determine appropriate minimum
5		numbers of candidates, which shall provide for at
6		least three candidates for the final seat, and maximum
7		numbers of candidates.
8	(d)	In making its presentations, the <u>regents</u> candidate
9	advisory	council shall:
10	(1)	Develop a statement that includes the selection
11		criteria to be applied and a description of the
12		responsibilities and duties of a member of the board
13		of regents and distribute this statement to potential
14		candidates;
15	(2)	Screen and qualify candidates for each position on the
16		board of regents based on their background,
17		experience, and potential for discharging the
18		responsibilities of a member of the board of regents;
19	(3)	Publicly advertise pending vacancies and actively
20		solicit and accept applications from potential
21		candidates;

1	(4)	Develop and implement a fair, independent, and
2		nonpartisan procedure for selecting candidates to
3		serve on the board of regents; and
4	(5)	Require each candidate to disclose any existing or
5		anticipated contracts with the University of Hawaii or
6		any existing or anticipated financial transactions
7		with the University of Hawaii.
8	Upon subm	ission of the names of candidates to the governor,
9	[presenta	tions of] the regents candidate advisory council shall
10	[be made]	make available the names of candidates to the public
11	[by] <u>thro</u>	ugh the University of Hawaii.
12	(e)	For each board seat to be filled, the governor shall
13	select on	e nominee from among the candidates submitted by the
14	regents c	andidate advisory [council's presentations.] council.
15	(f)	The <u>regents</u> candidate advisory council shall consist
16	of seven	members to be appointed without regard to section 26-34
17	as follow	s:
18	(1)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
19		senate;
20	(2)	One member shall be appointed by the speaker of the
21		house of representatives;
22	(3)	One member shall be appointed by the governor;

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1	(4)	One member shall be appointed by one of the co-chairs
2		of the All Campus Council of Faculty Senate Chairs of
3		the University of Hawaii;
4	(5)	One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of
5		the Executive Council of the University of Hawaii
6		Student Caucus;
7	(6)	One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of
8		the Association of Emeritus Regents; and
9	(7)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
10		University of Hawaii Alumni Association;
11	provided	that members appointed under paragraphs (4) to (7)
12	shall be	selected from the general public and may include
13	members o	f the constituencies represented; provided further that
14	each appo	intee satisfies the requirements for appointment
15	provided	in this subsection, except that individuals who are or
16	have serv	ed as members of the executive councils or boards for
17	the organ	izations under paragraphs (4) [and] or (5) within the
18	last five	years immediately preceding the establishment $\underline{\text{of}}$ or a
19	vacancy o	n the <u>regents</u> candidate advisory council for which the
20	persons m	ay be qualified to fill shall not be eligible to serve
21	as member	s of the <u>regents</u> candidate advisory council.

1 The regents candidate advisory council shall be selected in a wholly nonpartisan manner. If any member has not been 2 appointed within one hundred eighty days of [the] May 1, 2007, 3 the sitting members on the regents candidate advisory council 4 5 shall make an interim appointment to fill the vacant seat. interim appointee shall satisfy the requirements for appointment 6 7 provided in this subsection and shall serve until the time when the appropriate appointing authority makes an appointment for 8 9 the vacant seat as provided in this subsection. Appointees to 10 the regents candidate advisory council shall have a general understanding of the purposes of higher education, the mission 11 of the University of Hawaii system, and the responsibilities of 12 the board of regents. Appointees shall be individuals who are 13 14 widely viewed as having placed the broad public interest ahead 15 of special interests, having achieved a high level of prominence in their respective professions, and being respected members of 16 17 the community. 18 (q) Members of the regents candidate advisory council shall serve four-year terms; provided that the three members 19 20 initially appointed by the governor, the president of the 21 senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives shall

serve for terms of two years; provided further that terms for

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- 1 appointments of the initial members of the regents candidate
- 2 advisory council shall be deemed to begin on July 1, 2007,
- 3 regardless of the actual date of appointment.
- 4 (h) If a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed in
- 5 the same manner and subject to the same qualifications as the
- 6 person's predecessor. The person appointed to fill a vacancy
- 7 shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person's
- 8 predecessor.
- 9 (i) The regents candidate advisory council shall operate
- 10 in a wholly nonpartisan manner. No individual, while a member
- 11 of the regents candidate advisory council, shall run for or hold
- 12 any elected office under the United States or the State or any
- 13 of its political subdivisions.
- 14 (j) The regents candidate advisory council shall convene
- 15 its first meeting on or after thirty-one days from May 1, 2007;
- 16 provided that, if thirty days after May 1, 2007, all the members
- 17 to which the regents candidate advisory council is entitled have
- 18 not yet been appointed, the regents candidate advisory council
- 19 shall convene its first meeting upon the appointment of a
- 20 majority of its members. The members of the regents candidate
- 21 advisory council shall choose a chairperson from among
- themselves. A majority of all the members to which the regents

- 1 candidate advisory council is entitled shall constitute a quorum
- 2 to conduct business. The concurrence of a majority of all the
- 3 members to which the regents candidate advisory council is
- 4 entitled shall be necessary to make any action of the regents
- 5 candidate advisory council valid. The regents candidate
- 6 advisory council shall meet annually and at other times as
- 7 necessary. The regents candidate advisory council shall be
- 8 exempt from part I of chapter 92.
- 9 (k) Members of the regents candidate advisory council
- 10 shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
- 11 expenses, including travel, board, and lodging expenses,
- 12 necessary for the performance of their duties.
- 13 (1) Information obtained, reviewed, or considered by the
- 14 regents candidate advisory council concerning potential
- 15 candidates that is not of public record shall be confidential;
- 16 provided that information concerning a candidate who is
- 17 appointed by the governor shall be disclosed as provided by law.
- 18 Confidential regents candidate advisory council information may
- 19 include:
- 20 (1) The names of potential candidates;
- 21 (2) Applications submitted to the regents candidate
- advisory council;

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1	(3)	Financial information;
2	(4)	Background checks;
3	(5)	Credit reports;
4	(6)	Summaries, surveys, and reports prepared for or on
5		behalf of the regents candidate advisory council;
6	<u>(7)</u>	Results of any evaluations or assessments conducted by
7		the regents candidate advisory council;
8	(8)	The substance and details of interviews with or
9		discussions between potential candidates and the
10		regents candidate advisory council; and
11	(9)	The substance and details of discussions and
12		deliberations of the regents candidate advisory
13		council and any of its committees."
14	SECTI	ON 5. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues c	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$152,000 or so much
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to	
17	establish a permanent administrative position for the regents	
18	candidate	advisory council.
19	The s	sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
20	Hawaii for	the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

Report Title:

UH; Regents Candidate Advisory Council; Appropriation

Description:

Clarifies that the name of the candidate advisory council is the "Regents Candidate Advisory Council". Requires a UH Board of Regents member, except the student member, to reside in the geographic area represented by the member. Requires the Governor to notify in writing the Council of vacancies on the BOR within 10 days of receiving notification that a BOR member is resigning or has died, or of removal by the Governor. Requires the submission of candidates within 60 days of a vacancy on the BOR that arises by resignation, death, or removal by the Governor. Clarifies that the Council is to submit the names of candidates to the Governor. Makes confidential information concerning potential candidates that is not of public record; provided that information relating to a candidate who is appointed by the Governor shall be disclosed. Appropriates funds to establish a permanent administrative position for the Council. (HB3226 HD2)
