#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTERIOR DESIGNERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 2 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 3 as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 INTERIOR DESIGNERS 6 -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 7 context clearly indicates otherwise, the following terms shall 8 have the following meanings: 9 "Board" means the interior design board. 10 "Interior design" means services that do not necessarily 11 require performance by an architect, such as administering 12 contracts for fabrication, procurement or installation in the 13 implementation of designs, drawings and specifications for any 14 project relating to the design of the interior of a structure, 15 and consultations, studies, drawings and specifications in 16 connection with reflected ceiling plans, space utilization, 17 furnishings or the fabrication of nonstructural elements within and surrounding interior spaces of buildings, but specifically 18

- 1 excluding mechanical and electrical systems, except for
- 2 specifications of fixtures and their location within interior
- 3 spaces.
- 4 "Licensed interior designer" or "licensed designer" means a
- 5 person licensed pursuant to this chapter.
- 6 § -2 Board. There is created the interior design board.
- 7 (a) The board shall be administratively attached to the
- 8 department of commerce and consumer affairs. The board shall
- 9 consist of five members appointed by the governor pursuant to
- 10 section 26-34; provided that the initial appointments shall be
- 11 for staggered terms so that not more than two members' terms
- 12 expire on December 31 of any year. Thereafter, members shall be
- 13 appointed for terms of three years. A vacancy shall be filled
- 14 by appointment by the governor for the unexpired term. A board
- 15 member shall not serve consecutive terms.
- 16 (b) All members of the board shall be residents of the
- 17 State. No more than two members shall be appointed from the
- 18 same county. Three members of the board shall be licensed
- 19 interior designers and two members shall be chosen to represent
- 20 the public and shall not have been licensed as interior
- 21 designers or have a significant financial interest, direct or
- 22 indirect, in the occupation regulated.

5	(1)	Shall administer, coordinate, and enforce this chapter

8	(2)	Shall adopt rules under chapter 91 to carry out the
9		purposes and policies of the chapter, including rules
10		relating to professional conduct, standards of
11	λ	performance, and professional examination and
12		licensure, reasonable license, application, renewal
13		and late fees, and the establishment of ethical
14		standards of practice for a licensed interior designer
15		in the State;
16	(3)	Shall require a licensee, as a condition of the
17		renewal of the license, to undergo continuing
18		education requirements as set forth in this chapter;
19	(4)	Shall maintain an official roster showing the name,
20		address, and license number of each interior designer
21		licensed pursuant to the chapter;

1	(5)	Shall conduct hearings and keep records and minutes
2		necessary to carry out its functions;
3	(6)	May adopt a common seal for use by licensed interior
4		designers; and
5	(7)	Shall do all things reasonable and necessary to carry
6		out the purposes of this chapter.
7	§ ·	-4 Requirements for licensure. Each applicant for
8	licensure	shall apply to the board. Except as otherwise
9	provided,	each applicant shall take and pass a nationally
10	standardi	zed examination. The board may adopt substantially all
11	or part o	f the examination and grading procedures of the
12	national (	council for interior design qualifications. Prior to
13	examination	on, the applicant shall provide substantial evidence to
14	the board	that the applicant:
15	(1)	Is a graduate of a five-year interior design program
16		from an accredited institution and has completed at
17		least one year of diversified interior design
18		experiences;
19	(2)	Is a graduate of a four-year interior design program
20		from an accredited institution and has completed at
21		least two years of diversified interior design
22		experience;

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1	(3)	Has completed at least three years of an interior
2		design curriculum from an accredited institution and
3		has completed three years of diversified interior
4		design experience;
5	(4)	Is a graduate of a two-year interior design program

- (4) Is a graduate of a two-year interior design program

  from an accredited institution and has completed four
  years of diversified interior design experience; or
- (5) Has apprenticed under a designer who has passed the national council for interior design qualification examination or a licensed designer for a minimum of eight years.
- 12 -5 License without examination. (a) If any person 13 applies for licensure within one year after the effective date 14 of this chapter and that person has either successfully completed the National Council of Interior Design qualification 15 16 examination or has completed at least eight years of full-time, 17 diversified experience in the practice of interior design, that 18 person may be issued a license without examination. Licensure 19 pursuant to this subsection shall be subject to the board's 20 discretionary review of the experience qualification.
- (b) The board may accept, in lieu of examination,
   satisfactory evidence of licensure in another state or country

- 1 where the qualifications are equal to or exceed those required
- 2 by this chapter, provided that the applicant holds a current
- 3 license in the other jurisdiction and has complied with all
- 4 other requirements of this chapter.
- 5 (c) The board may accept, in lieu of examination,
- 6 satisfactory evidence of licensure or certification by the
- 7 national council for interior design qualifications.
- 8 § -6 License; issuance; renewal; denial, suspension or
- 9 revocation. (a) A license shall be issued to every person who
- 10 presents satisfactory evidence of possessing the qualifications
- 11 of education, experience, and as appropriate, the examination
- 12 performance required by this chapter, provided that the
- 13 applicant has reached the age of majority and pays the required
- 14 fees.
- 15 (b) Each original license shall authorize the holder to
- 16 use the title of and be known as a licensed interior designer
- 17 from the date of issuance to the next renewal date unless the
- 18 license is suspended or revoked.
- (c) All licenses shall expire annually and shall be
- 20 renewed by submitting a completed renewal application,
- 21 accompanied by the required fees.

1	(d) A license may not be renewed until the licensee
2	submits satisfactory evidence to the board that, during the last
3	year, the licensee has participated in not less than eight hours
4	of continuing education approved by the board. The board shall
5	approve only continuing education that builds upon basic
6	knowledge of interior design. The board may make exceptions
7	from the continuing education requirement in emergency or
8	hardship cases.
9	(e) The holder of a license that has expired through
10	failure to renew may renew the license at any time within two
11	years from the date on which the license expired, upon approval
12	of the board.
13	(f) The board may adopt policies and procedures providing
14	for the establishment of an inactive status for licensees
15	temporarily not engaged in the practice of interior design.
16	(g) The board may deny, refuse to renew, suspend, or
17	revoke a license or impose probationary conditions when the
18	licensee has:
19	(1) Obtained the license by means of fraud,
20	misrepresentation, or concealment of material facts;

(2) Committed an act of fraud or deceit in professional

conduct or been convicted of a felony;

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1	(3)	Made any representation as being a licensed interior
2		designer prior to being issued a license, except as
3		authorized under this chapter;
4	(4)	Been found by the board to have aided or abetted an
5		unlicensed person in violating this chapter; or
6	(5)	Failed to comply with this chapter or the rules
7		adopted pursuant thereto.
8	S	-7 License required; penalty. (a) No person shall

10	(1)	Use the name or title of licensed interior designer
11		when the person is not the holder of a current, valid

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              Any interior decorator or individual offering interior

10	title "licensed interior designer" unless licensed in accordance		
11	with this chapter.		
12	(c) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to permit		
13	licensed interior designer to engage in the practice of		
14	professional engineering as licensed in chapter 464.		
15	S	-10 License fees. The fees for an original license,	
16	renewal o	f license, late charges, or any other fees authorized	
17	by this c	hapter shall be set by rule. The fee for initial	
18	licensure	shall not exceed \$ .	
19	S	-11 Disclosure requirements. (a) Interior design	
20	documents	prepared by a licensed interior designer shall contain	
21	a statement that the document is not an architectural or		
22	engineeri	ng study, drawing, specification, or design and is not	

- 1 to be used as the basis for construction of any load-bearing
- 2 framing, wall, or structure construction.
- 3 (b) Before entering into a contract, a licensed interior
- 4 designer shall clearly determine the scope and nature of the
- 5 project and the methods of compensation. The licensed interior
- 6 designer may offer professional services to the client as a
- 7 consultant, specifier, or supplier on the basis of a fee,
- 8 percentage, or mark-up. The licensed interior designer shall
- 9 have the responsibility of fully disclosing to the client the
- 10 manner in which all compensation is to be paid.
- 11 (c) A licensed interior designer shall not accept any form
- 12 of compensation from a supplier of goods and services in cash or
- 13 in kind, unless the licensed interior designer first informs the
- 14 client of the compensation."
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2009.
