A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. During the special session of 2005, the 2 legislature passed S.B. No. 1592, S.D. 1, H.D. 2, C.D. 1, which 3 was enacted as Act 8, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005 (Act 4 8), to create the Hawaii 2050 task force to review the Hawaii 5 state plan and the State's planning process. The office of the 6 auditor was required to prepare and submit to the legislature 7 the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. Act 8 expressed the 8 legislature's belief that government is responsible for 9 addressing immediate issues and meeting public needs while also 10 providing guidance to ensure a sustainable future. 11 The creation of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan comes 12 as the state faces a growing number of pressing concerns, 13 including the steady deterioration of public infrastructure; the 14 lack of affordable housing; a continued reliance on a service-15 based economy; the vulnerability of Hawaii in a volatile global 16 energy market; possible interruptions to travel and critical

food supplies; threats to fragile island ecosystems; and ever-

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- 1 increasing numbers of residents and visitors. These issues all
- 2 raise questions about the long-term limits of growth in the
- 3 state and motivate the need to begin planning and action to
- 4 ensure Hawaii's future.
- 5 Addressing and solving issues critical to Hawaii's way of
- 6 life and natural resources require coordinated community efforts
- 7 to produce comprehensive, long-range planning policies and
- 8 actions. Within that context, the mission of the Hawaii 2050
- 9 task force and the objectives of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability
- 10 plan are intended to revitalize the State's long-term planning
- 11 process to better guide the future development of Hawaii.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 13 (1) Set forth and adopt the Hawaii 2050 sustainability
- 14 plan;
- 15 (2) Establish a sustainability council to coordinate,
- implement, measure, and evaluate the progress of the
- 17 Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan and its related
- 18 activities; and
- 19 (3) Appropriate funds for the creation of the
- 20 sustainability council.

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H.B. NO. 3339

SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 1 2 adding a new chapter under title 13 to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 HAWAII 2050 SUSTAINABILITY PLAN -1 Findings and purpose. The legislature finds that 6 7 over the years, the Hawaii state plan under chapter 226 has 8 become outdated and there is a lack of awareness of the goals 9 embodied therein. In 2005, the legislature passed S.B. No. 10 1592, S.D. 1, H.D. 2, C.D. 1, which was enacted as Act 8, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, to create the Hawaii 2050 11 12 task force to review the Hawaii state plan and develop a 13 sustainability plan to address the vital needs of the state 14 through the year 2050. The office of the auditor was required 15 to prepare and submit to the legislature the Hawaii 2050 16 sustainability plan. 17 The task force developed a comprehensive sustainability plan that provides a definition for sustainability; identifies 18 19 quiding principles and five major goals for Hawaii 2050; 20 identifies and proposes strategic actions to implement these 21 five major goals, indicators to measure the success or failure 22 in various sustainability actions, and priority actions and

- 1 intermediate steps for a target date of 2020; and establishes
- 2 recommendations.
- 3 The purpose of this chapter is to:
- 4 (1) Set forth the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan, which shall serve as a guide for the future long-range
- 6 development of the state;
- 7 (2) Provide a mechanism to implement strategic actions to
- 8 achieve objectives and use indicators to measure
- 9 progress in the State's efforts to achieve its
- 10 objectives; and
- 11 (3) Establish a coordinating body for plan implementation,
- 12 progress review, and program coordination to provide
- for the integration of all major state and county
- 14 activities to achieve a sustainable future.
- 15 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, the
- 16 following words and terms shall have the following meanings
- 17 unless the context shall indicate another or different meaning
- 18 or intent:
- 19 "Ahupuaa" means a traditional native Hawaiian resource and
- 20 behavioral management system that ensures respect for the air,
- 21 land, water, and other scarce natural resources that make life
- 22 sustainable from the mountains to the sea.

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1 "Council" means the sustainability council. 2 "Kanaka Maoli" means native Hawaiians. "Plan" means the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. 3 4 "Task force" means the Hawaii 2050 task force established 5 under Act 8, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005. § -3 Sustainability; guiding principles. (a) As a 6 result of a statewide community effort and engagement process, 7 8 it was revealed that most Hawaii residents desire a balance 9 between economic, cultural, and environmental concerns. Thus, 10 sustainability is defined as a Hawaii that achieves the 11 following: (1) Respects the culture, character, beauty, and history 12 13 of the state's island communities: 14 (2) Strikes a balance between economic, social, community, and environmental priorities; and 15 16 (3) Meets the needs of the present without compromising 17 the ability of future generations to meet their own 18 needs. 19 The following principles or values are established as 20 the overall theme of the sustainability plan: 21 (1)To balance economic, social, community, and

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environmental priorities;

1	(2)	To respect and live within the natural resources and
2		limits of the state;
3	(3)	To achieve a diversified and dynamic economy;
4	(4)	To honor the host culture;
5	(5)	To make decisions based on meeting present needs
6		without compromising the needs of future generations;
7	(6)	To observe the principles of the ahupuaa system to
8		guide resource management decisions; and
9	(7)	To emphasize that everyone, including individuals,
10		families, communities, businesses, and government, has
11		the responsibility for achieving a sustainable Hawaii.

7	actions to accomplish each major goal.				
8	§ -5 Sustainability council; established. (a) There i				
9	established a sustainability council, which shall be a body				
10	corporate and a public instrumentality of the State, for the				
11	purpose of implementing this chapter. The council shall be				
12	placed administratively within the office of the auditor for				
13	administrative purposes until June 30, 2010. The council shall				
14	be placed administratively within the office of planning for				
15	administrative purposes beginning on July 1, 2010. The purposes				
16	of the council shall include the following:				
17	(1) Assisting in the adoption of the principles of				
18	sustainability as an important policy priority for the				
19	State;				
20	(2) Setting forth and implementing the Hawaii				
21	sustainability plan to serve as a long-range				
22	sustainability planning guide for the State; and

3	(b)	The	council shall consist of fifteen voting members to			
4	be appoin	ited b	y the governor to serve staggered terms and

2	education; and health and human services; provided
3	that at least one public member shall be a
4	representative of the state's population under twenty-
5	five years of age;
6	provided that, of the initial appointments, at least five of the
7	members shall be members of the Hawaii 2050 task force and be
8	appointed by the governor from a list of nominees submitted by
9	the task force, excluding task force members who are members of
10	the legislature or employees of the State, for a term of two
11	years to expire on June 30, 2010. The superintendent of
12	education and the director of the office of planning shall serve
13	as ex-officio, non-voting members. The general public shall be
14	permitted to submit nominations for council members.
15	(c) The members of the council appointed under subsection
16	(b) shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
17	expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in the performance
18	of their duties.
19	(d) The council shall appoint an executive director who
20	shall serve at the pleasure of the council and shall be exempt
21	from chapter 76. The council shall set the salary and duties of

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the executive director.

    Each advisory committee shall consist of five members who shall
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    serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses
    incurred in the performance of their duties. The members of the

    advisory committee shall be drawn from fields of activity
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    related to each category and be selected by the council.
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         SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $

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    the creation of a sustainability council to coordinate,
    implement, measure, and evaluate the progress of the Hawaii 2050
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    sustainability plan and its related activities.
         The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the
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auditor for the purposes of this Act.

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- 1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 2 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
