A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGH TECHNOLOGY.

HB HMS 2008-1353

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that:	
2	(1)	Hawaii's technology and defense-related industries
3		have shown strong growth and expansion potential;
4	(2)	To meet this potential, our workforce needs to be
5		trained to meet the demand for highly-skilled, highly-
6		specialized labor in areas such as high technology,
7		defense-aerospace, business, and finance;
8	(3)	By 2012, Oahu will have an estimated one hundred,
9		seventy-six thousand jobs to fill, with more than
10		fifty-one thousand of these jobs newly created; and
11	(4)	Hawaii's ability to fill these job openings with
12		talented, energetic individuals will help to determine
13		the future quality of life for our residents.
14	The legislature further finds that the development of an	
15	"employment anchor" facility, such as a high technology park,	
16	may be the key to preparing Hawaii's current and future	
17	workforce for the challenges involved in high technology. There	
18	is already a significant demand for an employment anchor from	

- 1 local technology businesses and major defense and aerospace
- 2 contractors who wish to establish businesses on Oahu. The
- 3 integration of these areas within the context of an employment
- 4 anchor would be an important first step in sustaining a vibrant
- 5 local technology industry.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to support Hawaii's high
- 7 technology industry by:
- 8 (1) Requiring the department of business, economic
- 9 development, and tourism to consult with the high
- 10 technology development corporation to plan for the
- 11 establishment of a high technology park on the island
- of Oahu; and
- 13 (2) Appropriating funds for the construction of
- infrastructure for the high technology park.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) The department of business, economic
- 16 development, and tourism, shall work with the department of land
- 17 and natural resources to identify appropriate lands, either
- 18 public or private, on Oahu that may be acquired for the high
- 19 technology park.
- 20 (b) The department of business, economic development, and
- 21 tourism shall consult with the high technology development
- 22 corporation to plan for the establishment of a high technology

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- 1 park on Oahu; provided that the plans shall include provisions
- 2 for the high technology development corporation to manage and
- 3 oversee the park's operations in cooperation with other
- 4 government agencies and private entities.
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for land
- 8 acquisition, planning, design, equipment, and construction costs
- 9 related to the infrastructure for a high technology park on
- 10 Oahu.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 13 this Act.

14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
