## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that consumers illegally
- 2 obtaining display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial
- 3 devices are violating state law.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to provide to the counties with
- 5 more authority to enforce and administer the state fireworks
- 6 control law.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 9 and to read as follows:
- 10 ""Carrier" means an individual or company engaged in
- 11 transporting passengers or goods for profit."
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending the definition of "Display fireworks" to
- 14 read as follows:
- ""Display fireworks" means any fireworks designed primarily
- 16 for exhibition display by producing visible or audible effects
- 17 and classified as display fireworks or contained in the
- 18 regulations of the United States Department of Transportation
