BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

9	(3)	A kindergarten, school, or program licensed by the
10		department of education;
11	(4)	A program that provides exclusively for a specialized
12		training or skill development for children, including
13		but not limited to programs providing activities such
14		as athletic sports, foreign language, the Hawaiian
15		language, dance, drama, music, or martial arts;
16	(5)	A multiservice organization or community association,
17		duly incorporated under the laws of the State that
18		operates for the purpose of promoting recreation,

1		health, safety, or social group functions for eligible
2		pupils in public and private schools through seventeen
3		years of age;
4	(6)	Programs for children four years of age and older that
5		operate for no more than two consecutive calendar
6		weeks in a three-month period;

8		facility or any other program for homeless persons
9		authorized under part VII of chapter 356D;
10	(8)	After-school, weekend, and summer recess programs
11		conducted by the department of education pursuant to

17	(10)	Any person who enters a home in a child caring

4	(b) Staff members of programs taught solely in Hawaiian		
5	that promote fluency in the Hawaiian language shall be exempt		
6	from any rules requiring academic training or certification.		
7	(c) Minimum health and safety requirements or standards as		
8	required by federal law may be imposed on any of the groups		
9	listed in this section that provide child care services and are		
10	reimbursed with federal funds.		
11	(d) Any person asserting an exemption under this section		
12	shall cooperate with the department in investigations relating		
13	to unlicensed child care."
