A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

HB3403 HD2 HMS 2008-2546

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that self-help housing is 2 the lowest-cost means of producing affordable housing for 3 very-low-income and low-income households. Self-help housing 4 programs target families who are unable to buy clean, safe 5 housing through conventional methods, and provides assistance to 6 very-low-income and low-income households to construct their own 7 homes. The savings from the reduction in labor costs allows 8 otherwise ineligible families to own their own homes.

9 In Hawaii, more than 1,100 homes have been constructed 10 using the self-help housing method for very-low-income, low-11 income, and moderate-income families. Additional funding, 12 especially in the area of technical assistance, could allow 13 self-help housing programs in the state to add an average of 50 14 additional units per year to production schedules. There is 15 limited funding for technical assistance, which includes funding 16 for construction supervision, development of construction plans, 17 contractor payment processing, project bidding, subcontractor

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1 monitoring, recruiting and qualifying self-help builders, and 2 family guidance and motivation throughout the entire self-help 3 housing process. The typical technical assistance cost per self-help housing unit is \$20,000. Although there are other 4 5 sources of funding available for the construction of homes, 6 additional funding to cover technical assistance costs will 7 provide additional benefits to self-help housing programs and allow these programs to provide more housing opportunities to 8 9 families in need.

10 The purpose of this Act is to establish a self-help housing 11 trust fund to be administered by the Hawaii housing finance and 12 development corporation to provide funds for land acquisition, 13 infrastructure costs, and technical assistance to self-help 14 housing programs in the state.

15 SECTION 2. Chapter 201H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended by adding a new subpart under part III to be 17 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

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" . SELF-HELP HOUSING TRUST FUND

19 §201H- Definitions. As used in this subpart, unless the 20 context otherwise requires:

21 "Fund" means the self-help housing trust fund established22 in this subpart.



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"Self-help housing" means a model of housing production in
 which purchasers reduce the cost of their homes by contributing
 "sweat equity" - their own labor in the construction of their
 own homes.

5 "Technical assistance" means any assistance necessary to 6 carry out housing efforts by or for very-low-income and low-7 income households to improve the quality or quantity of housing 8 available to meet their needs, including construction 9 supervision and planning, contractor payment processing and 10 bidding, subcontractor monitoring, recruiting and qualifying 11 self-help housing builders, and guiding and educating families 12 throughout the entire self-help housing process.

13 §201H- Self-help housing trust fund. (a) There is
14 established the self-help housing trust fund to be administered
15 by the corporation.

(b) An amount from the fund, to be set by the corporation
and authorized by the legislature, may be used for
administrative expenses incurred by the corporation in
administering the fund; provided that fund moneys shall not be
used to finance day-to-day administrative expenses of projects
that are allotted fund moneys.

22 (c) The following may be deposited into the fund:





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1	(1)	Appropriations made by the legislature;
2	(2)	Private contributions;
3	(3)	Interest;
4	(4)	Other returns; and
5	(5)	Moneys from other sources.
6	(d)	The moneys available in the fund shall be used to
7	provide,	in whole or in part, additional funding to self-help
8	housing o	rganizations for land acquisition, infrastructure, and
9	technical	assistance costs generated from self-help housing
10	projects	in the state. Permitted uses of the fund may include
11	but are n	ot limited to:
12	(1)	Construction supervision and planning;
13	(2)	Contractor payment processing and bidding;
14	(3)	Subcontractor monitoring;
15	(4)	Recruiting and qualifying self-help housing builders;
16	(5)	Guiding and educating families throughout the entire
17		self-help housing process; or
18	(6)	Other self-help housing services or activities as
19		provided in rules adopted by the corporation pursuant
20		to chapter 91.
21	(e)	Funds available for technical assistance of the self-

22 help housing project shall be limited to \$20,000 per unit.



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(f) The corporation shall submit an annual report to the
 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
 each regular session describing the projects funded, its efforts
 to develop self-help housing projects, a description of
 proposals submitted for self-help housing projects and action
 taken on the proposals, and any barriers to developing self-help
 housing projects.

8 §201H- Eligible self-help housing projects. (a) Funds 9 under this subpart shall only be provided to self-help housing 10 organizations that are tax-exempt charitable organizations under 11 the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) that offer self-help 12 housing services in the state and have an option on the land 13 they intend to develop.

14 (b) Technical assistance funding for self-help housing 15 projects shall be limited to projects targeted to very-low-16 income, low-income, and moderate-income families. For the 17 purposes of this subpart, the applicable median family income 18 shall be the median family income for the county or standard 19 metropolitan statistical area in which the project is located as 20 determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban 21 Development, as adjusted from time to time. Technical

assistance funding shall be provided based on the readiness of

the project to use moneys available in the fund, such as whether 1 2 the project site is ready for house construction or the track record of the eligible self-help housing organization in 3 4 producing self-help housing units. 5 (c) The corporation may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 and include other eligibility criteria as it deems necessary to 6 7 carry out the purposes of this subpart. 8 §201H-Additional powers. The powers conferred upon the 9 corporation by this subpart shall be in addition and 10 supplemental to the powers conferred by any other law, and nothing in this subpart shall be construed as limiting any 11 12 powers, rights, privileges, or immunities conferred." SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 13 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to be 15 16 deposited into the self-help housing trust fund. 17 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the self-help housing trust fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as 18 may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to be used to provide 19 20 additional funding for land acquisition, infrastructure, and 21 technical assistance costs generated by self-help housing 22 projects in the state.

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1	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
2	housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of
3	this Act.

4 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
