## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in order to assist
  law enforcement in its efforts to combat methamphetamine, the
  State needs a centralized real-time electronic logbook to
- 4 document transactions made at pharmacies that involve the sale
- 5 of products containing ephedrine, pseudophedrine, and
- 6 phenylpropanolamine. The purpose of this Act is to automate the
- 7 existing reporting requirements established in state law for
- $oldsymbol{8}$  purchasing pseudophedrine and similar substances.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 11 and to read as follows:
- 12 "§329- Electronic purchase logbook. (a) By December
- 13 31, 2008, the narcotics enforcement division of the department
- 14 of public safety shall establish and maintain an electronic
- 15 purchase logbook for entering transactions required to be
- reported pursuant to subsection 329-75(a). The logbook shall be
- capable of checking compliance with all applicable state,
- 18 county, and federal laws, including interfacing with other



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1	states to ensure comprehensive compliance. The logbook shall be
2	subject to random and warrantless inspection by state, county,
3	or federal law enforcement officers.
4	The narcotics enforcement division of the department of
5	public safety may contract with a private vendor to implement
6	this section.
7	(b) A pharmacy or retailer shall electronically record the
8	information obtained under this section and shall forward the
9	information in an electronic format designated by the
10	administrator for posting onto the electronic purchase logbook
11	established under this section.
12	As used in this section, "administrator" means the director
13	of public safety, or the director's designee.
14	(c) Purchase information shall be submitted in real-time
15	and shall include:
16	(1) The date of the transaction;
17	(2) The name, date of birth, and address of the person
18	making the purchase;
19	(3) The type of identification provided by the purchaser,
20	the identification number, and the issuing state or
21	agency; and

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1	(4)	The amount and name of the compound, mixture, or
2		preparation being purchased.
3	(d)	The narcotics enforcement division of the department
4	of public	safety shall provide access to the electronic purchase
5	logbook to	<u>):</u>
6	(1)	Any person authorized to prescribe or dispense
7		products containing ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or
8		phenylpropanolamine for medical or pharmaceutical
9		<pre>care;</pre>
10	(2)	A state, county, or federal law enforcement official;
11	(3)	A state, county, or federal prosecutor;
12	(4)	A state, county, or federal official who requests
13		access for the purpose of facilitating a product
14		recall necessary for the protection of public health
15		and safety; and
16	(5)	The board of pharmacy for the purpose of investigating
17		a suspicious transaction.
18	<u>(e)</u>	The narcotics enforcement division of the department
19	of public	safety shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to
20	carry out	the purposes of this section.
21	(f)	The narcotics enforcement division of the department
22	of public	safety shall destroy any transaction record maintained
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1	in the electronic purchase logbook within two years from the			
2	date of its entry unless the electronic record is being used in			
3	an ongoing criminal investigation or criminal proceeding.			
4	(g) A person commits an offense under this section if the			
5	person knowingly:			
6	(1) Releases or discloses to any unauthorized person any			
7	confidential information collected and maintained			
8	under this section; or			
9	(2) Obtains confidential information for a purpose not			
10	authorized by this section.			
11	A violation of this subsection is a misdemeanor.			
12	As used in this section, "knowingly" has the meaning			
13	provided in section 702-206."			
14	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.			
15	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
