A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that agriculture plays a
- 2 vital role in Hawaii's efforts to become more self-sustainable.
- 3 Agriculture not only contributes to the state's economy by
- 4 providing employment opportunities, products for export, and a
- 5 stage for tourism, but also performs a public service by helping
- 6 to perpetuate a rural lifestyle for Hawaii's residents who in
- 7 turn provide stewardship for Hawaii's lands and water.
- **8** With the demise of the plantations that once controlled
- 9 vast acres of pineapple and sugar cane fields, comes the need
- 10 for the diversification of Hawaii's agriculture industry.
- 11 Hawaii must also diversify its economic base beyond a reliance
- 12 on tourism. A revived and revitalized agriculture industry
- 13 promises not only to achieve this but also to sustain and
- 14 stabilize Hawaii's food supply and protect the open space and
- 15 lifestyle that both residents and visitors value.
- 16 Currently, Hawaii's agriculture and value-added product
- 17 industry contributes \$2,400,000,000 to the state's economy and
- 18 employs more than thirty-eight thousand people. During the past

- 1 twenty years, the value of diversified agriculture in Hawaii has
- 2 more than doubled, reaching a record \$370,900,000 in farm-level
- 3 revenues in 2002.
- 4 The agriculture industry should continue to explore new
- 5 opportunities as prime agricultural land becomes available. At
- 6 present, about one hundred thousand acres of former sugar cane
- 7 and pineapple land--prime agricultural land--lie fallow. Recent
- 8 estimates suggest that if all this land could be put to
- 9 productive use through successful agricultural ventures, an
- 10 additional \$1,700,000,000 to \$4,400,000,000 could be infused
- 11 into the state's economy.
- 12 To take advantage of these opportunities, and to provide
- 13 the necessary support for the overall transition of Hawaii's
- 14 agriculture industry from plantation agriculture to diversified
- 15 agriculture, more resources must be directed toward agricultural
- 16 research and development. Agricultural research is key to
- 17 maintaining Hawaii's competitiveness in an agricultural market
- 18 that is becoming increasingly global.
- 19 The legislature believes that the Hawaii Agriculture
- 20 Research Center, the University of Hawaii college of tropical
- 21 agriculture and human resources, the department of agriculture,
- 22 and the United States Department of Agriculture Pacific Basin

- 1 Agricultural Research Center should work collaboratively to
- 2 expand their agricultural research efforts. These research
- 3 organizations are critical to the State's efforts to strengthen
- 4 and improve the agriculture industry, expand employment
- 5 opportunities for residents, and revitalize the economy.
- 6 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii Farm Bureau
- 7 Federation is a non-profit agricultural organization
- 8 representing the interests of, and exemplifying a strong
- 9 commitment to, the agriculture industry in Hawaii and can ensure
- 10 that agricultural research and marketing meet the needs of local
- 11 farmers and ranchers. The Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation has
- 12 frequently partnered with institutions like the Hawaii
- 13 Agriculture Research Center, the University of Hawaii college of
- 14 tropical agriculture and human resources, and the department of
- 15 agriculture on many research and market development projects.
- 16 The Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation has also worked with many
- 17 other kinds of commodity organizations, including sugar,
- 18 pineapple, papaya, macadamia, coffee, flower, fruit, vegetable,
- 19 aquaculture, seed corn, forestry, and livestock organizations to
- 20 formulate research needs for the entire agriculture industry.
- 21 Therefore, the legislature finds that the most logical
- 22 organization to oversee and expend funding for agricultural



- 1 research and market development in the State is the Hawaii Farm
- 2 Bureau Federation.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 4 Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation to conduct agricultural research
- 5 and development.
- 6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
- 9 sum of \$1,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for
- 10 fiscal year 2008-2009 for the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation to
- 11 conduct agricultural research and development.
- 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 13 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
