
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. There is appropriated out of the general
2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4,221,956, or so
3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
4 the sum of \$4,032,414, or so much thereof as may be necessary
5 for fiscal year 2008-2009, to provide funds and resources to the
6 department of education, office of information technology
7 services for an integrated comprehensive student support system,
8 including the special education database, the continued
9 implementation and enhancements to the centralized student
10 information system, a financial management system, and the
11 enhancement of the associated network support services,
12 including the establishment of a service center to provide
13 specialized information technology services as requested by
14 schools on a reimbursable basis and that these funds be
15 separately identified.

16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
17 of education for the purposes of this Act.



1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$844,440, or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
4 sum of \$850,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for
5 fiscal year 2008-2009, to provide additional funds and resources
6 for the expansion of the State's high capacity network to
7 accommodate ever increasing needs in the use of technology in
8 the classrooms.

9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
10 of education for the purposes of this Act.

11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
