A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRICAL AND PLUMBING TRADES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION	1. Section 448E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to re	ead as follows:
3	" §448E -5	Minimum requirements. An applicant shall possess
4	the following	minimum qualifications:
5	(1) Jou	rney worker electrician. Every applicant to be
6	eli	gible for the journey worker electrician
7	exa	mination shall be at least eighteen years of age
8	and	shall provide satisfactory evidence of:
9	(A)	Successfully completing an accredited academic or
10		apprenticeship program covering the principles of
11		electrical theory and the requirements of the
12		National Electric Code; or
13	(B)	At least five years of full-time experience in
14		residential or commercial wiring [of at least
15		five years full-time] or its equivalent, but [not
16		less] no fewer than [10,000] ten thousand hours
17		of experience in the trade under the supervision
18		of a journey worker or supervising electrician.

1	(2)	Journey worker specialty electrician. Every applicant
2		to be eligible for the journey worker specialty
3		electrician examination shall be at least eighteen
4		years of age and shall [have had at] provide
5		satisfactory evidence of:
6		(A) Successfully completing an accredited academic or
7		apprenticeship program covering the principles of
8		electrical theory and the requirements of the
9		National Electric Code; or
10		(B) At least five years' experience in the trade.
11	(3)	Supervising electrician. Every applicant to be
12		eligible for the supervising electrician examination
13		shall [have]:
14		(A) <u>Have</u> been registered with the board as a journey
15		worker electrician for at least a period of four
16		years in the trade or [shall have had] provide
17		satisfactory evidence of equivalent experience in
18		the trade[-]; and
19		(B) Provide satisfactory evidence of having
20		successfully completed an associate degree or
21		certificate program or electrical apprenticeship
22		program covering the principles of electrical

1		theory and the requirements of the National
2		Electric Code.
3	(4)	Supervising specialty electrician. Every applicant to
4		be eligible for the supervising specialty electrician
5		examination shall [have]:
6		(A) <u>Have</u> been registered with the board as a journey
7		worker specialty electrician for at least a
8		period of four years [in the trade or shall have
9		had] or provide satisfactory evidence of
10		equivalent experience in the trade $[-]$; and
11		(B) Provide satisfactory evidence of having
12		successfully completed an accredited academic or
13		apprenticeship program covering the principles of
14		electrical theory and the requirements of the
15		National Electric Code.
16	(5)	Journey worker plumber. Every applicant to be
17		eligible for the journey worker plumber examination
18		shall have had experience of at least five years'
19		full-time or its equivalent but not less than 10,000
20		hours as a journey worker's or master plumber's
21		helper, and is able to furnish satisfactory evidence
22		of such fact.

3		egistered with the board as a journey worker plumber
4		or at least two years or shall have had equivalent
5		experience in the trade.
6	(7)	aintenance electrician. Every applicant to be

9		A) Be not less than eighteen years of age;
10		B) Provide satisfactory evidence of having
11		successfully completed an accredited academic or
12		apprenticeship program covering the principles of
13		electrical theory and the requirements of the
14		National Electric Code; [and shall have had] and
15		C) Provide satisfactory evidence of at least one
16		year of experience in performing electrical
17		maintenance work or proof of two years of
18		schooling in the electrical trade.
19	(8)	ourney worker industrial electrician. Every
20		pplicant to be eligible for the journey worker
21		ndustrial electrician examination shall [be]:
22		A) Be at least eighteen years of age;

ı		<u>(B)</u>	Provide satisfactory evidence of having
2			successfully completed an accredited academic or
3			apprenticeship program covering the principles of
4			electrical theory and the requirements of the
5			National Electric Code; [and shall have had] and
6		<u>(C)</u>	Provide satisfactory evidence of at least five
7			years of full-time experience in industrial
8			electrical work [of at least five years full-
9			time] or its equivalent, but [not less] no fewer
10			than [10,000] ten thousand hours.
11	(9)	Supe	rvising industrial electrician. Every applicant
12		to b	e eligible for the supervising industrial
13		elec	trician examination shall [have]:
14		(A)	<u>Have</u> been registered with the board as a journey
15			worker industrial electrician for a period of at
16			least four years or [shall have had] provide
17			satisfactory evidence of equivalent experience in
18			the trade[-]; and
19		<u>(B)</u>	Provide satisfactory evidence of having
20			successfully completed an accredited academic or
21			apprenticeship program covering the principles of

1	electrical theory and the requirements of the
2	National Electric Code."
3	SECTION 2. Section 448E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"[+] §448E-5.5[+] Examination. (a) Every applicant shall
6	be examined and shall pass an examination to be eligible for
7	licensure. The board shall provide in its rules the passing
8	score for the examination. The board may examine applicants or
9	may contract with professional testing services to prepare,
10	administer, and grade the examination as may be required for the
11	purpose of this section.
12	(b) Every applicant shall pay an examination fee as
13	provided in rules adopted by the director pursuant to chapter
14	91. Should the board contract with a professional testing
15	agency to prepare, administer, and grade the examination, the
16	examination fee may be paid directly to the testing agency by
17	the director or the examinee.
18	(c) The examinations for all levels of electricians shall
19	test the applicant on the applicant's knowledge of the
20	principles of electrical theory and the requirements of the
21	National Electrical Code. The examinations shall test the
22	applicant at the level of knowledge gained through the

- 1 successful completion of an associate degree or certification
- 2 program in electrical theory from an accredited institution or
- 3 electrical apprenticeship."
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun, before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
