HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A STUDY ON CONSTRUCTION.

WHEREAS, the construction industry is one of the main 1 drivers of the local economy, providing employment and job 2 opportunities for nearly forty thousand workers throughout the 3 State; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the construction industry is the main reason that 6 tax revenues to the State and counties have exceeded revenue 7 8 forecasts: and 9 10 WHEREAS, the construction industry has a direct impact on consumer spending and has been indirectly responsible for the 11 increase in sales of major consumer goods and other related 12 13 services with revenues of nearly \$7,500,000,000 annually; and 14 15 WHEREAS, in turn, public works projects contribute significantly to the health of the construction industry and 16 also directly impact the local economy; and 17 18 WHEREAS, there is a threat of a recession on the horizon, 19 and this threat requires that government play a proactive role 20 in mitigating the force of the recession; now, therefore, 21 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 24 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the University of 25 26 Hawaii is requested to study the feasibility of establishing a construction advisory body composed of economists, construction 27 industry experts, public procurement officers, construction 28 union officials, and the Director of Business, Economic 29 Development, and Tourism to monitor the local economy and to 30 assist the Governor and the executive branch in initiating 31 32 capital improvement projects during economic downturns in order

1 to stabilize the local construction industry and the overall 2 state economy; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Hawaii is requested to submit findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days before the Regular Session of 2009; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 11 University of Hawaii, the Chairperson of the Board of Regents of 12 the University of Hawaii, the Governor, and the Director of 13 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism.
