HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE FORMATION OF A TASK FORCE TO REVIEW THE POTENTIAL EXPANSION OF THE CURRENT PRACTICES AND EQUIPMENT OF HAWAII'S TELEMEDICINE SYSTEM.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, access to knowledgeable and qualified medical doctors is arguably the single most important factor for people to live long and healthy lives; and
5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, Hawaii's unique geography as an island chain poses difficulties for patients seeking to access medical doctors without incurring significant travel costs; and
9 10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, other states with access-to-care issues in isolated communities are exploring ways to ease difficulties for both patients and medical doctors, by using methods that allow both parties to travel no further than their own neighborhoods to interact; and
14 15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, one approach to the access problem in Hawaii would be to expand the State's telemedicine system, which is still in its infancy; and
19 20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, greater access to health care through telemedicine would extend medical information and physicians' care throughout the State, without requiring patients to leave their home island; and
23 24 25 26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, after telemedicine was first implemented in 1998 by former Governor Benjamin Cayetano as a pilot project, it became clear, even in its earliest stage, that there are endless possibilities for telemedicine to change lives for the better; and



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WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest for the residents 1 of Hawaii to continue to explore the possibilities of expanding 2 the current telemedicine system to encompass the State's twelve 3 hospitals; now, therefore, 4 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 7 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 8 Health is requested to form a task force to explore the 9 feasibility of further implementation of the telemedicine 10 systems so that citizens of Hawaii may benefit from it; and 11 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department is requested to 14 direct the task force to examine the following issues: 15 (1) Current use of telemedicine and equipment; 16 17 (2) Costs for expansion; 18 19 Timeframe for full implementation of an expansion (3) 20 21 project; and 22 23 (4) Potential difficulties or problems that may arise during or after implementation; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in forming the task force, the 26 Director of Health is requested to include: 27 28 (1)The Director of Health or the Director's designee; 29 30 One member from the staff of the John A. Burns School 31 (2)of Medicine at the University of Hawaii; 32 33 (3) One member from the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation; 34 35 (4) One member from a for-profit health care organization; 36 37 and 38 (5)One member from a non profit hospital or health care 39 organization; and 40 41



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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health is requested to appoint all members of the task force no later than 2 thirty days after the adjournment sine die of the Regular 3 Session of 2008, and is requested to convene the initial meeting 4 of the task force within thirty days after appointment of its 5 members; and 6

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health is 8 required to provide necessary administrative, professional, 9 technical, and clerical support to the task force; and 10

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 12 submit a preliminary report of its findings and recommendations 13 to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 14 convening of the Regular Session of 2009, and a final report of 15 its findings and recommendations, including any necessary 16 17 proposed legislation not later than twenty days prior to the 18 convening of the Regular Session of 2010; and

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the 21 Director of Health, and the Chairperson of the Employer-Union 22 Health Benefits Trust Fund. 23
