## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ESTABLISH A GLOBAL WARMING TASK FORCE TO ASSESS THE IMPACTS OF GLOBAL WARMING ON THE STATE.

WHEREAS, there is consensus in the scientific community 1 that global warming and climate change are occurring at an 2 accelerated pace and pose a threat to human society; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the effects of global warming have the potential 5 to impact the citizens, natural resources, and economy of 6 7 Hawaii; and 8 WHEREAS, Hawaii, as an island state, is particularly 9 vulnerable to rising ocean levels as a consequence of global 10 11 warming; and 12 WHEREAS, rising sea levels would have specific impacts on 13 Hawaii, including shoreline erosion, difficulties in air and sea 14 shipping, encroachment on existing buildings and infrastructure, 15 and population health effects; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the State must take action to address the near-18 term and long-term effects of global warming and rising ocean 19 20 levels; and 21 WHEREAS, before action may be taken, efforts must be made 22 to fully predict and evaluate the effects that rising ocean 23 levels and other consequences of climate change will have upon 24 Hawaii; now, therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 27 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 28 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 29 Health is requested to establish a Global Warming Task Force to 30 assess the effects of global warming in the State; and 31
