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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO DECLARE A STATE OF EMERGENCY REGARDING THE CRITICAL CONDITION OF OAHU'S TRAFFIC, AND REQUESTING THE ASSISTANCE OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO TAKE IMMEDIATE ASSISTING ACTION TO RESOLVE THE PRESENT CRISIS.

1 WHEREAS, as evidenced by the ancient saying of "While 2 people are saying peace and safety, destruction will come on them suddenly" our human history has demonstrated time and time 3 4 again that improper planning, poor protocols, defective systems, 5 a failure of imagination and an inability for persons in positions of leadership and key responsibilities to adapt to 6 change or recognize limitations has resulted in devastating 7 disasters and often horrific moments in human history; and 8 9

10 WHEREAS, unforeseen natural disasters and actions by hostile individuals or entities often expose or exploit our 11 weaknesses in the absolute worst way possible, such as the 12 terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001, the effects of 13 14 Hurricane Katrina on the City of New Orleans, or the 2006 Hawaii Earthquake, all of which were disasters whose detrimental 15 16 effects could have been mitigated or avoided altogether if 17 preventative measures had been taken; and 18

19 WHEREAS, similarly, the present lack of sufficient transportation infrastructure on the Island of Oahu, State of 20 21 Hawaii, is overwhelmingly obvious by the daily excesses of 22 traffic congestion in which thousands of vehicles are massed on our roads and freeways, and likewise painfully apparent by the 23 total shutdown of transportation and many critical island 24 functions during events - either natural or man-influenced -25 that damage our roadways or obstruct them, often paralyzing 26 27 whole regions and large populations for hours; and 28

29 WHEREAS, in times of natural disasters and enemy action, 30 not only is regularly functioning infrastructure critical, but



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2 as to mitigate the effects of destruction to existing assets; 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, as painfully demonstrated by the experience of December 7, 1941, the State of Hawaii is America's lead 6 battleground for conflicts in the Pacific Ocean, making the 7 8 Hawaiian Islands a bastion of freedom that must constantly be 9 guarded with a higher level of security and preparedness than the other contiguous states of the Union; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, alternative roads presently do not exist capable 13 of meeting an emergency demand of large numbers of military or rescue vehicles amidst enemy action or large scale disaster, and 14 our current roads are overly burdened, with a level of service 15 "F" regarding peacetime traffic flow on H-1; and 16 17

redundant and back-up infrastructure is extremely necessary so

18 WHEREAS, communities such as Ewa which are located in areas 19 already difficult to access during times of peak traffic, may 20 suffer immensely in the event of disaster or enemy action, 21 depriving them of critical access to first responders or 22 evacuation capability; and 23

24 WHEREAS, the precedent to declare a state of emergency 25 based on the pall of presently intolerable situations was 26 evidenced as recently as April 11, 2007 when Governor Linda 27 Lingle declared a state of emergency regarding the island of 28 Kauai's homeless population; now, therefore, 29

30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 31 32 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that in light of these 33 rare and unusual threats which face our Islands, that this Body 34 urges the recognition from the Governor that a state of 35 emergency exists regarding the critical condition of Oahu's traffic, and likewise requests the Federal government to 36 37 immediately assist to resolve the present crisis before such 38 disasters and enemy attacks can occur; and 39

40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that duly certified copies of this 41 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the 42 Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Department of Homeland 43 Security, the Department of Defense, the U.S. Department of 44 Transportation, the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the



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Vice President of the United States of America, and the 1 2 President of the United States of America.
