HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH TO CONVENE AND FACILITATE A BLUE RIBBON PANEL TO PERFORM A COMPREHENSIVE INVENTORY OF ALL OF HAWAII'S ACUTE CARE AND LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR NECESSARY EXPANSION OF SUCH FACILITIES FOR THE STATE BETWEEN NOW AND THE YEAR 2020.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's health care system consists of a myriad 1 of services that must be coordinated and integrated to ensure 2 3 access to quality care at the appropriate level for all of Hawaii's residents; and 4 5 WHEREAS, a single user of health care often accesses 6 different providers that deliver different products and 7 8 services, and may transition from one level of care to another 9 over a period of time; and 10 11 WHEREAS, acute care hospitals deliver care to the most seriously ill patients incurring high costs due to staffing 12 needs, costs of technology that permeates hospitals in the form 13 of equipment and supplies, the high costs of medication, and 14 15 regulatory and quality requirements; and 16 WHEREAS, patients who receive care at hospitals and recover 17 enough of their health so that they no longer require 18 hospitalization, but are still in need of services, should be 19 20 transferred out of the hospital to a provider that can appropriately and safely care for their needs; and 21 22 WHEREAS, such a transfer supports an improved quality of 23 24 life for the patient and sustains the integrity of the acute care system by creating availability of bed-space for others who 25 may require hospitalization; and 26 27 WHEREAS, a balanced flow of patient movement matches the 28 appropriate provider to the needs of the patient and better 29 manages the financing of health care; and 30 31



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WHEREAS, the provision of long-term care, either in a 1 facility or in a home- and community-based setting, is far less 2 3 costly than hospital care; and 4 WHEREAS, unfortunately, due to unique and unusual 5 circumstances, Hawaii has a shortage of beds in nursing 6 7 facilities relative to its population; and 8 WHEREAS, most of Hawaii's long-term care facilities, which 9 include skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, 10 adult residential care homes, and foster family homes, are full 11 nearly all the time; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, placement in a long-term care facility is especially difficult when a patient has a medically complex 15 condition that demands resources that are not available at many 16 long-term care facilities in Hawaii; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, as a result, many acute care hospital patients who are ready for long-term care cannot be discharged and must wait 20 in the acute care hospital until space becomes available; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the shortage of long-term care beds is an 23 undesirable situation from three perspectives: 24 25 (1)The quality of life of the patient is diminished; 26 27 (2) A patient in an acute care hospital who is waitlisted 28 for long-term care occupies a bed that may be needed 29 by someone else with an acute illness or injury; and 30 31 Hospital care is very expensive, so the waitlisted (3) 32 patient contributes to higher costs in an acute care 33 hospital; 34 35 and 36 37 WHEREAS, to properly address the problem of the adequate 38 supply of acute care and long-term care facility space we must 39 first understand what is currently available; now, therefore, 40 41 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 42 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 43 Session of 2008, that the Director of Health is requested to 44 HR HMS 2008-2509
