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HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THROUGH ITS OFFICE OF HEALTH CARE ASSURANCE TO IMPLEMENT A PROGRAM TO PROMOTE AND DEVELOP AND TO INSURE AN ADEQUATE SUPPLY OF ELDERLY HEALTH CARE FACILITIES AND SERVICES BY PROVIDING EDUCATION, TRAINING AND SUPPORT TO THE HEALTH CARE FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, the legislature finds that a very serious issue 1 facing our state is the lack of capacity currently in our 2 community to provide adequate care in community-based 3 residential settings; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, this is true not only for individuals with disabilities, but for the vast majority of elderly individuals 7 in need of basic medical care or assistance with their 8 activities of daily living; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the legislature further finds that one of the 11 unfortunate results of this lack of capacity has been a 12 13 disturbing increase in the number of Hawaii residents discharged from hospitals or treatment facilities in Hawaii to facilities 14 on the mainland; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the legislature finds this to be an unacceptable 17 situation and as an island community, we have a responsibility 18 to take care of our elders and individuals with disabilities in 19 20 a proper fashion; and 21 WHEREAS, the notion of shipping our kupuna to the mainland 22 merely because they are old or ill and are occupying valuable 23 space in a hospital while they are waiting for a bed to open up 24 at a nursing home or care home is shocking; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, the legislature finds that the Department of Health has the mandate to promote health in the state by 28 ensuring that there is an adequate supply of elderly health care 29 facilities and services; and 30 31

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WHEREAS, the Department of Health is mandated to reverse 1 2 this alarming trend of sending our local elders and citizens with disabilities to the mainland simply because they failed to 3 provide adequate capacity to care for them here at home; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the Department of Health must take affirmative 7 action to build, develop, and increase our state's capacity to care for our people in a way that preserves their dignity and 8 9 allows them to reside in a community-based setting and receive 10 care appropriate to their needs; now, therefore, 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 13 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 14 15 Health is requested to promote health in the state by ensuring 16 that there is an adequate supply of elderly health care facilities and services to care for Hawaii's people; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health 20 examine and determine the adequacy of the statutes, administrative rules, and inspection and enforcement processes, 21 and make recommendations to modify them in order to promote, 22 develop and expand residential care facilities for the disabled 23 24 and elderly; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health provide community-based care and foster homes with education, 27 28 training and support to ensure its expansion to meet the increasing demand; and 29 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health 32 is requested to submit a report to the Legislature no later than 33 twenty days prior to the convening of the 2009 Regular Session; 34 and 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, 36 37 Director of Human Services, and the Attorney General. 38 39 hit Tflotomell OFFERED BY: CAB HR 0310 -2008 MAR 1 0 2008
