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HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE A COMPREHENSIVE REPORT OF POST FELIX CONSENT DECREE CHILD AND ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES AND FUNDING.

WHEREAS, the Felix v. Cayetano Consent Decree (Consent 1 Decree) mandated fundamental change, wherever necessary, to 2 provide educational, mental health, and related services to 3 disabled children that satisfies the law and the principles of 4 5 the Child and Adolescent Service System Program; and 6 WHEREAS, the Consent Decree provided that eligible children 7 8 receive free and appropriate public education, as required under the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and the 9 Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Section 504, and that the system 10 provide a continuum of services, programs, and placements 11 according to family- and child-centered principles; and 12 13 WHEREAS, to benefit from their education, the Consent 14 Decree mandated that the State identify children and youth ages 15 16 0-20 who are in need of behavioral and emotional support, and to provide adequate and timely intervention and delivery of 17 culturally relevant services in home-based, school-based, and 18 community-based settings; and 19 20 WHEREAS, by June 30, 2000, the State was obligated to 21 design and implement a system of care that functions in 22 accordance with the standards and operating principles of the 23 Consent Decree, which was terminated in 2006; and 24 25 WHEREAS, despite the removal of court oversight, there are 26 critical issues that have been identified that need more 27 attention at this point in time by the Department of Health 28 29 (DOH) and Department of Education (DOE), including: 30 (1) Providing consistent and appropriate quality services; 31 32



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1 (2) Lack of service system development in certain areas in 2 the state; 3 (3) Lack of accountability systems; and 4 5 (4) The numbers of children being sent to mainland 6 placement because of lack of local alternatives; 7 8 9 and 10 WHEREAS, budgetary shortfalls and lack of oversight at DOH 11 12 and DOE may contribute to inadequate services and infrastructure 13 to build and maintain an adequate system of care; and 14 WHEREAS, the No Child Left Behind Act requires schools to 15 focus on annual progress and test children with disabilities at 16 grade level rather than at their developmental level, resulting 17 in DOE's shift in focus from services to children with mental 18 health needs to meeting annual progress and test scores; now, 19 therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 22 23 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, that DOH, in coordination with DOE, is 24 requested to provide a comprehensive report of post Consent 25 Decree child and adolescent mental health services and funding; 26 27 and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that DOH and DOE include in the 30 report: 31 32 (1)The funding levels of child and adolescent mental health and special education services, currently, and 33 also while DOH and DOE were operating under court 34 oversight, including identifying all state, federal, 35 and federal matching dollar streams of funding; 36 37 The numbers of children with mental health needs 38 (2)served and client outcomes, currently, and also while 39 the DOH and DOE were operating under court oversight 40 and currently; and 41 42 The number of vacant positions, along with issues 43 (3)related to filling vacant positions within DOE, and 44



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similar information provided by the Department of 1 Human Resources Development for filling vacant 2 positions within DOH's Child and Adolescent Mental 3 Health Division: 4 5 6 and 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the DOH and DOE consider the 8 development of a quality assurance process that includes 9 community advocates, and a paid staff person to provide progress 10 reports on the development of the quality assurance process; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that reports related to the above 13 issues be submitted to this body no later than 60 days prior to 14 the convening of the Regular Session of 2009; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 18 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Superintendent of Education, Chairperson of the Board of Education, Director of 19 Health, Director of Human Resources Development, Director of 20 21 Human Services, Chairperson of the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Task Force, and President and Chief Executive Officer of 22 Mental Health America of Hawaii. 23 24 25 26 OFFERED BY:
