HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ADOPT A "COMPLETE STREETS" POLICY.

WHEREAS, Hawaii faces the multiple challenges of traffic 1 congestion, pedestrian safety, adequate bicycle rights-of-way, 2 obesity, and an aging population, all of which could begin to be 3 addressed through comprehensive planning that encourages 4 bicycling and walking; and 5 6 WHEREAS, increasing traffic congestion has a detrimental 7 effect not only on motorists, but also on the environment and 8 the economy, due to increased fuel consumption and carbon 9 dioxide production, as well as the cost of transportation 10 maintenance, new infrastructure, and lost productivity; and 11 12 WHEREAS, in addition to decreasing our dependence on 13 14 foreign oil, bicycling and walking would help to safeguard the 15 coastline; and 16 WHEREAS, on November 7, 2006, the City and County of 17 Honolulu adopted Charter Amendment 8, with support from seventy-18 19 seven per cent of Honolulu voters to establish Honolulu as a pedestrian- and bicycle-friendly city; and 20 21 WHEREAS, "Complete Streets" are designed and operated to 22 enable safe access for all users, including pedestrians, 23 bicyclists, motorists and transit riders of all ages and 24 abilities; and 25 26 WHEREAS, planning, designing, and constructing complete 27 streets that include footpaths, bicycle trails, and roundabouts 28 can reduce the need for costly infrastructure retrofitting in 29 the future; and 30 31 WHEREAS, various states are adopting complete streets 32 policies by way of legislation, internal departmental policies, 33 or public education; now, therefore, 34 35



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
 Session of 2008, that the Department of Transportation is urged
 to adopt a Complete Streets policy as part of its policies
 directed at future transportation projects; and
