HOUSE RESOLUTION

STRONGLY URGING THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO IDENTIFY AND ACQUIRE FUNDING FOR THE RESTORATION OF THE WAIKIKI WAR MEMORIAL NATATORIUM.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii has no more historically significant architectural icon than the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium, a 2 memorial that honors the sacrifices of those who paid the 3 ultimate price in World War I; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium is what 7 Hawaiians can "wahipana", a sacred place of legendary beauty where the spirit is uplifted; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the artfully constructed interface between natural and built environment has been hailed as a work of genius, 11 harmoniously joining land and sea in a magnificent, yet 12 sensitive statement, making the Natatorium worth preserving 13 based on artistic merit alone; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the facade features a Beaux-Arts style ornamental 16 arched entryway measuring over twenty feet tall, designed by 17 famed architect Louis P. Hobart, easily being one of Hawaii's 18 19 most recognizable examples of creative architectural excellence; 20 and 21 22 WHEREAS, although the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium has deteriorated since its initial construction, in 2001, over four 23 million dollars of repairs were completed on the site including 24 a facade restoration and the renovation of the bleachers and 25 26 public restrooms; and 27 WHEREAS, the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium is listed on 28 29 both the National and Hawaii Registers of Historic Places; and 30

1 WHEREAS, allowing the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium to 2 fall into disrepair because of inaction and procrastination would be irresponsible and would be disrespectful to all who 3 4 paid the ultimate price for our nation in World War I, and would render an entire stretch of beach unsafe and incur large clean-5 6 up costs; and 7 8 WHEREAS, other options, such as moving the facade and 9 filling the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium for athletic purposes, are not feasible due to the catastrophic damage that 10 11 would result from the movement and destabilization to the 12 bleachers, restrooms, and facade due to the increased load and drag due to the fill, respectively; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, tourism is the main economic driver of Hawaii's 16 economy, providing numerous jobs and incomes to our residents; 17 and WHEREAS, the National Trust for Historic Preservation has 18 19 proven that cultural heritage tourists are more affluent 20 overall, stay longer and spend more while contributing to global 21 understanding through cultural exchange and commerce; and 22 23 WHEREAS, cultural and heritage visitors spend, on average, 24 \$623 per trip compared to \$457 for all U.S. travelers, excluding the cost of transportation; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of this State to 28 preserve Hawai`i's uniqueness, sense of place, and cultural 29 identity for the benefit of all its residents as well as its 30 visitors; and 31 32 WHEREAS, restoration of the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium is already fully permitted, but will require more funding to 33 move forward on the restoration; now, therefore, 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 36 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 37 Session of 2008, that the Congressional Delegation of the State 38 39 of Hawaii is strongly urged to identify and acquire funding for the restoration of the Waikiki War Memorial Natatorium, 40
