HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE RETAIL MERCHANTS OF HAWAII AND HAWAII FOOD INDUSTRY ASSOCIATION TO SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THEIR PUBLIC-EDUCATION CAMPAIGN ABOUT "REDUCING, REUSING, AND RECYCLING" PLASTIC BAGS.

WHEREAS, non-biodegradable, plastic bags have significant 1 adverse effects on the natural environment; and 2 3 WHEREAS, in every stage, from production to disposal, non-4 5 biodegradable plastic bags create pollution and environmental hazards; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, non-biodegradable plastic bags require millions of barrels of crude oil, an increasingly scarce resource, to 9 manufacture; contribute to unsightly litter; crowd landfills 10 with non-biodegradable waste; and endanger marine animals; and 11 12 WHEREAS, for every square mile of ocean, it is estimated 13 that there are over 46,000 pieces of plastic, including plastic 14 bags; and 15 16 WHEREAS, over 100,000 marine animals die every year after 17 becoming entangled with this plastic waste; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, numerous governments worldwide have placed fees or bans on plastic bags and have encouraged the use of 21 alternatives, such as compostable plastic bags and reusable 22 bags; and 23 24 WHEREAS, compostable plastic bags are made of material that 25 will decompose by natural processes in a safe and timely manner; 26 27 and 28 WHEREAS, reusable bags have handles, are made of cloth or 29 other durable material, and have been specifically designed and 30 manufactured for multiple reuse; and 31



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1 WHEREAS, encouraging the use of these environmentally 2 preferable alternatives to non-biodegradable plastic bags will help to protect the natural environment and decrease the amount 3 4 of waste flowing into our landfills; and 5 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has a significant interest in 6 7 protecting its natural environment by reducing the number of plastic bags imported into the islands, thereby reducing the 8 9 number of plastic bags entering its landfills and diminishing the litter caused by these bags; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Retail Merchants of Hawaii (RMH) and Hawaii 12 Food Industry Association (HFIA) have embraced the concept of 13 "reduce, reuse, and recycle" and have embarked on a public-14 education campaign to encourage the use of reusable tote bags 15 16 and in-store recycling of plastic bags to effect change in 17 public behavior; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 20 Session of 2008, that RMH and HFIA are requested to submit to 21 the Legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the 22 23 convening of the Regular Session of 2009, a report on the 24 progress and effectiveness of their public-education campaign 25 in: 26 27 Reducing the import of plastic bags into the state; (1)28 29 (2)Promoting the use of reusable tote bags by consumers; 30 and 31 Increasing the recycling of used plastic bags; 32 (3) 33 34 and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report shall also include information about the effectiveness of in-store recycling; and 37



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 1 2 Resolution be transmitted to the Department of Health, RHM, and 3 HFIA.
