HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO CONDUCT A PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN FOR THE QUEST-ACE HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM.

1 2 2	WHEREAS, improving Hawaii's healthcare safety net is a sensible goal that results in a healthier community; and
3 4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, a three-year survey conducted between 2003-2005 indicated that approximately 13 percent of adults age 19-64 were uninsured, or more than 99,000 people; and
8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, although Hawaii's Prepaid Health Care Act requires employers to provide insurance coverage to employees who work at least 20 hours per week, there is a gap group of uninsured adults; and
12 13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, this gap group includes the working poor who have part-time jobs and don't earn enough to pay for private insurance programs, but their incomes make them ineligible to participate in existing state programs; and
17 18 19 20	WHEREAS, QUEST-ACE (Adult Coverage Expansion) is a health insurance program designed to cover up to 20,000 gap group adults; and
21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, QUEST-ACE is open to adults with children, the blind and disabled, and some small business owners; and
25 26 27	WHEREAS, QUEST-ACE includes a variety of benefits and services, including outpatient visits, inpatient hospital days, mental health visits, and limited prescription drug and dental
28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, language and interpreter services are also included, a much-needed benefit for those with limited English-
32	speaking skills; and

WHEREAS, the burden on overcrowded emergency rooms will be 1 2 eased since insurance coverage will encourage early, preventative health care; and 3 4 WHEREAS, coverage provided under QUEST-ACE will likely 5 result in savings to hospitals that lose an estimated 6 \$150,000,000 per year providing care to the uninsured or 7 underinsured; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, an innovative program such as QUEST-ACE needs to be adequately publicized to the approximately 99,000 uninsured 11 12 adults in Hawaii; now, therefore, 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 15 Session of 2008, that this body urges the Department of Human 16 17 Services (DHS) to conduct a public awareness campaign for the QUEST-ACE health insurance program; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED in its public awareness campaign, DHS is requested to create literature that could be included in 21 utility statements such as gas, water, and electric bills, and 22 posters or flyers that could be posted at all University of 23 Hawaii system campuses, community health centers, welfare 24 25 service centers, and nonprofit human service organizations; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services. 29 30 31 OFFERED BY:
