2 extension; and that is able to support communications using the
3 transmission control protocol/Internet protocol (TCP/IP) suite,
4 or its subsequent extension, or other IP-compatible protocols;
5 and that provides, uses, or makes accessible, either publicly or
6 privately, information to users.

7 "Internet portal" means the centralized electronic
8 information system by which public information is provided via
9 dial-in modem or continuous link to the public through
10 subscriptions.

11 "Portal manager" means the entity or person engaged to
12 manage and operate the Internet portal on behalf of the State.

13 "Value added electronic services" means services including,
14 but not limited to:

- 15 (1) Providing periodic, continual, and ongoing access to
16 information maintained by a government agency without
17 requiring separate requests for information as it is
18 created;
- 19 (2) Compiling data or performing other research services;
- 20 (3) Permitting the electronic filing of reports, renewals,
21 or application; or



1 (4) The ability to transact business over the Internet
2 portal.

3 **§ -2 Charges for services.** Any statute to the contrary
4 notwithstanding, government agencies may charge for value added
5 electronic services provided through the portal manager.

6 **§ -3 Access Hawaii committee; establishment; membership;**
7 **chairperson.** (a) There is established within the department of
8 accounting and general services, the access Hawaii committee.

9 (b) The committee shall consist of not more than thirteen
10 voting ex officio members, or their designated representatives,
11 as follows:

12 (1) The comptroller of the department of accounting and
13 general services;

14 (2) The administrator of the information and communication
15 services division in the department of accounting and
16 general services;

17 (3) The administrator of the state procurement office;

18 (4) The director of the office of information practices;

19 (5) The directors of not more than three government
20 agencies using or planning to use the services of the
21 portal manager;

22 (6) The administrative director of the judiciary;



1 (7) A representative of the legislature's data management
2 system; and

3 (8) The chief information officers of the four counties.

4 (c) The comptroller of the department of accounting and
5 general services shall serve as the chairperson of the
6 committee.

7 **§ -4 Duties of the committee.** The committee shall
8 provide oversight of the portal manager including:

9 (1) Review of the annual strategic plan and periodic
10 reports on potential new applications and services
11 submitted by the portal manager;

12 (2) Review and approval of all charges to portal users;

13 (3) Review and approval of service level agreements
14 negotiated by government agencies with the portal
15 manager;

16 (4) Review of the annual financial reports and audit of
17 the portal manager;

18 (5) Review of annual customer satisfaction surveys
19 conducted by the portal manager; and

20 (6) Review of performance measures of the portal submitted
21 as part of the service management plan for portal-wide
22 indicators and application specific indicators.



1 **§ -5 Annual report.** The committee shall submit an
2 annual report on the operations of the portal."

3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
