A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GASOLINE PRICE GOUGING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Hawaii's geographic isolation has made it 1 particularly vulnerable to high gasoline prices, particularly 2 during abnormal disruptions of the gasoline market. Gasoline is 3 one product that consumers cannot do without. No one should be 4 allowed to take advantage of abnormal market conditions to gouge 5 Hawaii consumers of this precious resource. 6 Due to recent catastrophic events, the cost of gasoline has 7 become a concern for consumers nationally and locally. 8 9 purpose of this Act is to protect Hawaii consumers from price gouging in the purchase of gasoline during periods of abnormal 10 disruption of the marketplace caused by extraordinary adverse 11 12 circumstances. Currently, absent a local natural disaster, or a formal 13 14 declaration of emergency by the governor, the only way that the State can prosecute someone for price gouging is pursuant to the 15 unfairness doctrine of chapter 480, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 16

17 This Act will enhance enforcement authority by specifically

1	business to sell or offer to sell any gasoline product for an			
2	amount that represents an unconscionably excessive price during			
3	any abnormal disruption of the market, whether that disruption			
4	occurred in Hawaii or in other parts of the world.			
5	SECTION 2. Section 486B-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
6	amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately			
7	inserted and to read as follows:			
8	""Abnormal disruption of the market" means any change in			
9	the market resulting from an actual or imminently threatened			
10	stress of weather, convulsion of nature, failure or shortage of			
11	electric power or other source of energy, strike, civil			
12	disorder, war, military action, or national or local emergency.			
13	"Unconscionably excessive price" means a price at which the			
14	amount charged represents a gross disparity between the price of			
15	the gasoline product and:			
16	(1) The price at which the same grade of gasoline product			
17	was sold or offered for sale by the gasoline-related			
18	business in the usual course of business immediately			
19	prior to the onset of the abnormal disruption of the			

market; or

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1	(2) The price at which the same or similar grade of		
2	gasoline product is readily obtainable by other buyers		
3	in the trade area;		
4	and the disparity is not substantially attributable to increased		
5	orices charged by suppliers to the gasoline-related business or		
6	increased costs attributable to market forces beyond the control		
7	of the gasoline-related business selling or offering to sell the		
8	gasoline product."		
9	SECTION 3. Section 486B-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended to read as follows:		
11	"[+] §486B-3[+] Unlawful profiteering. Any person who		
12	sells petroleum products and who, with intent to enhance the		
13	price or restrict the supply of petroleum products:		
14	(1) Wilfully causes or permits preventable waste in the		
15	production, manufacture, storage, or distribution of		
16	petroleum products;		
17	(2) Prevents, limits, lessens, or restricts the		
18	manufacture, production, supply, or distribution of		
19	petroleum products;		
20	(3) Enters into any contract, combination, or conspiracy		
21	in restraint of trade or commerce;		

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1	(4)	Exacts or demands any unjust or unreasonable profit in
2		the sale, exchange, or handling of petroleum products;
3		[Or]
4	(5)	Sells or offers to sell gasoline at an unconscionably
5		excessive price during any abnormal disruption of the
6		market; or
7	[(5)]	(6) In any way aids or abets the doing of any act
8		prohibited in paragraphs (1) to $[\frac{(4)_{r}}{}]$ $(5)_{r}$
9	commits a	n unlawful trade practice."
10	SECT	ION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
11	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
12	begun, be	fore its effective date.
13	SECT	ION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
