A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that article X , section 1
2	of the Hawaii Constitution clearly indicates that the State has
3	a constitutional obligation to support charter school
4	facilities. In relevant part, it states that "[t]he State shall

- provide for the establishment, support and control of a 5
- statewide system of public schools free from sectarian control, 6
- a state university, public libraries and such other educational 7
- institutions as may be deemed desirable, including physical 8
- 9 facilities therefor."
- 10 Department of education schools that convert to charter school status have pre-existing facilities and remain on the 11 department's regular repair and maintenance and capital 12 improvement program schedules. Furthermore, presently, all of 13
- 14 Hawaii 3R's projects must be selected from the department of
- education repair and maintenance backlog unfunded list, which 15
- only includes department of education-operated conversion 16
- charter schools. Start-up charter schools, however, receive no 17

- 1 such support and only received legislative appropriations for
- 2 facilities assistance once, after the 2006 session, in the
- 3 amount of \$660 per pupil.
- 4 Except for that single occasion, all of the twenty-three
- 5 currently operating start-up charter schools have always been
- 6 forced to pay for occupancy costs out of a per-pupil allocation
- 7 that is already significantly lower than that provided to
- 8 department of education-operated schools.
- 9 Although not intended to serve as the exclusive, sole means
- 10 of meeting the State's constitutional obligation to support
- 11 charter school facilities, the legislature finds that
- 12 innovative, cost-effective public-private partnerships are a
- 13 promising means of addressing this issue. The legislature
- 14 further finds that a program similar to Hawaii 3R's would
- 15 provide a mechanism to leverage scarce public resources with
- 16 private resources and to use state investments to leverage
- 17 federal funding to provide support to the construction, repair,
- 18 and maintenance of charter school facilities, which often is
- 19 unavailable absent state funding.
- The legislature further finds that:

1	(1)	Any charter school in the state may participate in
2		programs of the fund, be they start-up or conversion;
3		and
4	(2)	The charter school administrative office may
5		prioritize funding for projects that exhibit best
6		practices in green building or sustainable
7		construction, rehabilitation, repair, and maintenance.
8	Kanu	o ka aina learning ohana is in the process of
9	examining	the feasibility of establishing a community
10	developme	nt financial institution to support charter school
11	facility	financing. The legislature may consider transferring
12	the Hawai	i charter school facilities fund and related tax credit
13	reporting	responsibilities from the department of education to
14	such a co	mmunity development financial institution upon its
15	establish	ment.
16	The	purpose of this Act is to support the funding of
17	charter s	chool facilities by establishing a program similar to
18	the Hawai	i 3R's. This objective is accomplished by creating the
19	Hawaii ch	arter school facilities fund, which will support only
20	charter s	chools, not-for-profit corporations supporting charter
21	schools,	and community development financial institutions

1	supportin	g charter schools. This program differs from Hawaii
2	3R's in t	hat:
3	(1)	It would be expanded to include acquisition,
4		predevelopment, rehabilitation, construction, and
5		other capital improvement projects, in addition to
6		repair and maintenance; and
7	(2)	It would accommodate the greater complexity of capital
8		improvement projects.
9	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
11	and to re	ad as follows:
12	" <u>§30</u>	2B- Hawaii charter school facilities fund. (a)
13	There is	established in the state treasury the Hawaii charter
14	school fa	cilities fund, into which shall be deposited:
15	(1)	Appropriations by the legislature to the Hawaii
16		charter school facilities fund;
17	(2)	Contributions, grants, endowments, gifts in cash or
18		otherwise, loans, and bond financing from all sources,
19		including corporations or other businesses,
20		foundations, government, individuals, and other
21		interested parties; and
22	(3)	Income and capital gains earned by the fund.

The fund shall be administered by the charter school 1 2 administrative office, and the moneys in the fund shall be used 3 only for the specific purposes for which the fund is 4 established, pursuant to this section. 5 (c) The office shall spend moneys from the fund in the 6 form of grants, loans, or contracts to charter schools, nonprofit corporations that benefit charter schools, or 7 8 contracts with private vendors for the repair, maintenance, 9 acquisition, predevelopment, rehabilitation, construction, or 10 other capital improvement projects of charter school facilities, 11 or facilities administered, operated, or developed by nonprofit corporations for the support of charter schools in Hawaii in 12 13 accordance with this section. 14 (d) There is established the Hawaii charter school 15 facilities fund advisory board within the charter school 16 administrative office, for administrative purposes. The board shall consist of the executive director of the office, who shall 17 18 serve as an ex-officio non-voting member, and five members who 19 shall be appointed without regard to section 26-34. Kanu o ka 20 aina learning ohana shall appoint two members, the Hawaii charter school network shall appoint two members, and the 21 22 charter school review panel shall appoint one member. The

15	given the	facts and circumstances prevailing at the time of
16	action or	decision. In so doing, the office shall consider the
17	fund's lo	ng- and short-term needs in carrying out its purposes,
18	its prese	nt and anticipated financial requirements, the expected
19	total ret	urn on its investments, price trends, and general
20	economic	conditions.

1	<u>(f)</u>	Ther	e may be an endowment component of the Hawaii
2	charter s	chool	facilities fund, and the office may accumulate
3	net incom	e, wh	ich shall be added to the principal.
4	<u>(g)</u>	The	use of any state moneys may be restricted by the
5	legislatu	re in	appropriating moneys to the Hawaii charter school
6	facilities fund.		
7	<u>(h)</u>	Any	organization submitting a proposal to the office
8	for money	s sha	ll meet the following standards at the time of
9	applicati	on an	d:
10	(1)	<u>Be:</u>	
11		<u>(A)</u>	A for-profit organization duly registered under

2	shall agr	ee to comply with the following conditions prior to

7		laws; and
8	(3)	Comply with any other requirements prescribed by the
9		office to ensure adherence by the recipient of the
10		award with applicable federal, state, and county laws,
11		ordinances, rules, and regulations, and with the
12		purposes of this section.
13	<u>(j)</u>	Chapter 103D shall not apply to organizations or
14	agencies	that apply for grants or contracts under this section.
15	(k)	The Hawaii charter school facilities fund shall be
16	audited a	nnually by an independent auditor. The results of each
17	annual au	dit shall be submitted to the department of budget and
18	finance n	ot later than thirty days from the date the office
19	receives	the audit results. The charter school administrative
20	office sh	all retain for a period of three years and permit the
21	departmen	t of budget and finance, state legislators, and the
22	auditor,	or their duly authorized representatives, to inspect

2	other evi	dence that is pertinent to the Hawaii charter school
3	facilitie	s fund.
4	(1)	For every dollar of state moneys granted by the Hawaii
5	charter s	chool facilities fund to the project, there shall be a
6	minimum o	f \$1 in value matched by private, federal, or county
7	sources;	provided that this matching value may include:
8	(1)	The fair market value of contributions of in-kind
9		goods and services;
10	(2)	Federal funding intended for charter schools that
11		passes through the department as the federally-
12		designated state education agency or local education
13		agency;
14	(3)	Federal funding that passes through any agency, board,
15		panel, or other subdivision of the State for the
16		benefit of charter schools; and
17	(4)	Any funding from the office of Hawaiian affairs that
18		did not originate as general revenues appropriated to
19		it by the legislature.
20	(m)	The charter school administrative office shall submit
21	an annual	report to the legislature on the progress of the fund

- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 education for the purposes of this Act.

- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
