A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSEUDOEPHEDRINE SALES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 329-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a
4	pharmacy or retailer may dispense, sell, or distribute to a
5	person without a prescription not more than 3.6 grams per day $_{\underline{\prime}}$
6	without regard to the number of transactions, of any product,
7	mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of
8	pseudoephedrine, its salts, optical isomers, or salts of optical
9	isomers $[au]$ as the only active ingredient or in combination with
10	other active ingredients; provided that the pharmacy or retailer
11	[complies] shall comply with the following conditions:
12	(1) The product, mixture, or preparation shall be
13	dispensed, sold, or distributed from an area not
14	accessible by customers or the general public, such as
15	behind the counter or in a locked display case and
16	where the seller delivers the product directly into
17	the custody of the purchaser; [and]

1	(2)	Any person purchasing or otherwise acquiring any
2		product, mixture, or preparation shall[+
3		(A) Produce proper identification containing
4		the photograph, date of birth, printed name,
5		[and] signature, and address of the individual
6		obtaining the controlled substance; [and
7		(B) Sign a written log, receipt, or other program or
8		mechanism approved by the administrator, showing
9		the date of the transaction, name and address of
10		the person, and the amount of the compound,
11		mixture, or preparation.
12	<u>(3)</u>	The pharmacy or retailer shall record, in an
13		electronic log on software provided by the narcotics
14		enforcement division of the department and approved by
15		the administrator: the date of the transaction; the
16		name, address, and date of birth of the person; the
17		type of identification provided by the person; the
18		agency issuing the identification used; any unique
19		number associated with the identification; and the
20		amount and name of the compound, mixture, or
21		preparation; and

1	(4)	The pharmacy or retailer shall record the information
2		required under paragraph (3) on an Excel worksheet on
3		software provided by the narcotics enforcement
4		division of the department and electronically mailed
5		to the narcotics enforcement division once a month.
6		The information shall be retained by the pharmacy or
7		retailer for a period of two years. The electronic
8		log shall be capable of checking compliance against
9		all state and federal laws, including interfacing with
10		other states to ensure comprehensive compliance, and
11		shall be subject to random and warrantless inspection
12		by county or state law enforcement officers.
13	No person	shall purchase, receive, or otherwise acquire more
14	than nine	grams of any product, mixture, or preparation
15	containing	g any detectable quantity of pseudoephedrine or its
16	salts, iso	omers, or salts of optical isomers within a thirty-day
17	period, ex	scept that this limit shall not apply to any quantity
18	of such pr	coduct, mixture, or preparation dispensed pursuant to a
19	valid pres	scription."
20	SECTI	ON 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
21	matured, p	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
22	begun, bef	fore its effective date.

- 1 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050;
- 4 provided that a pharmacy or retailer shall have until January 1,
- 5 2050, to establish the electronic log using software provided by
- 6 the narcotics enforcement division of the department of public
- 7 safety required under this Act.

Description:

Requires electronic logs of pseudoephedrine sales to be made via an Excel worksheet provided by the Department of Public Safety Narcotics Enforcement Division and maintained for two years in a form searchable by law enforcement. Effective 1/1/2050. (SB2373 HD1)
