A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSEUDOEPHEDRINE SALES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 329-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 2 "(a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a 3 pharmacy or retailer may dispense, sell, or distribute to a 4 person without a prescription not more than 3.6 grams per day, 5 6 without regard to the number of transactions, of any product, mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of 7 pseudoephedrine, its salts, optical isomers, or salts of optical 8 isomers $[\tau]$ as the only active ingredient or in combination with 9

> The product, mixture, or preparation shall be (1) dispensed, sold, or distributed from an area not accessible by customers or the general public, such as behind the counter or in a locked display case and where the seller delivers the product directly into the custody of the purchaser; [and]

other active ingredients; provided that the pharmacy or retailer

13		The information shall be retained by the pharmacy or
14		retailer for a period of two years. The electronic
15		log shall be capable of being checked for compliance
16		against all state and federal laws, including
17		interfacing with other states to ensure comprehensive
18		compliance, and shall be subject to random and
19		warrantless inspection by county or state law
20		enforcement officers.
21	No person	shall purchase, receive, or otherwise acquire more
22	than nine	grams of any product, mixture, or preparation
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- 1 containing any detectable quantity of pseudoephedrine or its
- 2 salts, isomers, or salts of optical isomers within a thirty-day
- 3 period, except that this limit shall not apply to any quantity
- 4 of such product, mixture, or preparation dispensed pursuant to a
- 5 valid prescription."
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 7 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 8 begun, before its effective date.
- 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050;
- 12 provided that a pharmacy or retailer shall have until January 1,
- 13 2050, to establish the electronic log using software provided by
- 14 the narcotics enforcement division of the department of public
- 15 safety required under this Act.

Description:

Requires pharmacies and retailers to maintain an electronic log of sales of pseudoephedrine and related products and transmit the information to the Department of Public Safety Narcotics Enforcement Division on a monthly basis. Effective 1/1/2050. (SB2373 HD2)
