A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REMOTE DISPENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many individuals 2 living in underserved or remote areas need improved access to 3 medications and pharmacy services. A remote dispensing program 4 that allows for the dispensing of low-cost medications through 5 the use of a secure remote dispensing machine and patient counseling via a two-way interactive videoconferencing system 6 will help to resolve the dual problem of access to prescription 7 8 drugs and pharmacists for low-income populations.

9 The purpose of this Act is to permit the operation of remote10 dispensing machines by a licensed pharmacy or pharmacist.

SECTION 2. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statues, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

14 "<u>§461-</u> <u>Remote dispensing pharmacy; operations.</u> (a) A
15 remote dispensing pharmacy shall be under the direct supervision
16 of the registered pharmacist in charge of the responsible
17 pharmacy who shall:

14	SECT	ION 3. Section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
15	amended by adding five new definitions to be appropriately		
16	inserted and to read as follows:		
17	""Remote dispensing" means the practice of dispensing drugs		
18	through t	he use of trained personnel, telecommunications, and	
19	information technologies to patients at a remote dispensing		
20	pharmacy.		
21	"Rem	ote dispensing machine" means a device used for	
22	dispensing unit-of-use drugs that is operated using information		
23	technolog	ies and is located in a remote dispensing pharmacy.	

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1	"Remote dispensing pharmacy" means the area in an
2	institutional facility, including a federally qualified health
3	center, providing outpatient medical care in any county, by
4	dispensing prescription drugs through the use of a remote
5	dispensing machine.
6	"Remote dispensing technician" means an individual who
7	assists the pharmacist in various activities specific to the
8	remote dispensing pharmacy.
9	"Responsible pharmacy" means a pharmacy that operates a
10	remote dispensing machine located in this state and holds a valid
11	permit issued by the board pursuant to section 461-14."
12	SECTION 4. Section 461-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	"§461-14 Permits for operation of pharmacy[-];
15	notification of remote dispensing pharmacy. (a) It shall be
16	unlawful for any person to operate, maintain, open, change
17	location, or establish any pharmacy or remote dispensing
18	pharmacy within the [State] state without [first] having <u>first</u>
19	obtained a permit or prior notification from the board.
20	(b) Application for permits and notifications shall be
21	made on a form to be prescribed by the board. Separate
22	[application] applications shall be made and separate permits



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1	and notif	ications issued for each separate place at which is				
2	carried on any of the operations for which a permit <u>or</u>					
3	notificat	ion is required.				
4	(C)	On evidence satisfactory to the board, a permit or

15	(d)	[No application] <u>An application</u> for a permit shall be				
16	refused [except pursuant to] for noncompliance with this section				
17	[and] <u>but</u>	only after notice to the applicant and a full and fair				
18	hearing.					
19	<u>(e)</u>	To operate a remote dispensing pharmacy, a responsible				
20	pharmacy	shall submit to the board the following information:				
21	(1)	A completed form prescribed by the board;				



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1	(2)	The name, address, and permit number of the
2		responsible pharmacy;
3	(3)	The name and license number of the pharmacist in
4		charge of the responsible pharmacy;
5	(4)	The name of the institutional health care facility and
6		the address of the remote dispensing pharmacy;
7	(5)	A floor plan of the remote dispensing pharmacy, which
8		shall indicate the space or location of the remote
9		dispensing machine;
10	(6)	The date the remote dispensing pharmacy will be ready
11		for operations;
12	(7)	A description of the security system;
13	(8)	A description of the computer link, video link, and
14		audio link; and
15	(9)	Photographs of the remote dispensing pharmacy area,
16		including but not limited to the remote dispensing
17		machine, the security system, computer link, video
18		link, audio link, confidential-communications area,
19		and locked cabinet.
20	A remote	dispensing pharmacy's failure to notify the board in
21	writing w	ithin thirty days of any changes to the information
22	described	in paragraphs (1) to (9) or failure to comply with



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1	this chapter shall be considered a violation of this chapter and
2	shall result in disciplinary action against the pharmacist in
3	charge and the responsible pharmacy.
4	(f) Permits and licenses issued under this section and
5	section 461-15 may be closed upon written request from the
6	holder of the permit or license. The board shall approve all
7	requests by the holder for closure of a permit or license. Once
8	the closure is approved, the holder of the closed permit or
9	license shall be required to reapply as a new applicant to
10	conduct business where a permit or license is required."
11	SECTION 5. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
12	shall submit an annual report to the legislature no later than
13	twenty days prior to the convening of the regular legislative
14	session, beginning with the regular session of 2009 and ending
15	with the regular session of 2013. The report shall include
16	information on the use of the remote dispensing machines.
17	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050 and
20	shall be repealed on January 1, 2013.
