A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD WASTE RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that waste disposal is an
- 2 issue of critical importance throughout the islands. Section
- 3 226-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, declares that "it shall be the
- 4 policy of this State to . . . [p]romote re-use and recycling to
- 5 reduce solid and liquid wastes and employ a conservation ethic."
- 6 The legislature further finds that state facilities and
- 7 public schools are among the largest institutional sources of
- 8 food waste, in spite of current recycling efforts. Despite
- 9 statewide policies, recycling efforts still reduce only a
- 10 fraction of the solid and liquid waste generated. Landfills on
- 11 all islands are approaching or have already reached their
- 12 maximum capacity, and both the expansion of current landfills
- 13 and relocation efforts are meeting widespread community
- 14 opposition.
- 15 Food waste recycling falls within the program elements of
- 16 the integrated solid waste management plans under chapter 342G,
- 17 Hawaii Revised Statutes.



- 1 The purpose of this Act is to establish a three-year pilot
- 2 project in one or more schools, to be selected by the department
- 3 of education and in partnership with the department of health,
- 4 for recycling food waste as part of the State's integrated solid
- 5 waste management plans under chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised
- 6 Statutes.
- 7 SECTION 2. The department of education, in partnership
- 8 with the department of health, shall develop and implement a
- 9 three-year food waste recycling pilot project in one or more
- 10 schools that is in accordance with chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised
- 11 Statutes.
- 12 The program sites shall be determined by the department of
- 13 education as those most suitable in meeting the pilot project's
- 14 objectives.
- 15 The department of health shall cooperate with the
- 16 department of education to develop and implement the components
- 17 of the pilot project.
- 18 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to
- 21 develop and implement a three-year food waste recycling pilot
- 22 project in one or more public schools.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. The department of education, with the
- 4 assistance of the department of health, shall submit interim
- 5 reports of the pilot project to the legislature no later than
- 6 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of
- 7 2009 and 2010, and a final report to the legislature no later
- 8 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
- 9 of 2011. The reports shall include information and
- 10 recommendations about the efficacy of and the costs associated
- 11 with the food waste recycling pilot project. The final report
- 12 shall also include a recommendation on whether the food waste
- 13 recycling pilot project should be made permanent.
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008, and
- 15 shall be repealed on June 30, 2011.

Description:

Requires the department of education, in a partnership with the department of health, to establish a three-year food waste recycling pilot project within one or more public schools.

Appropriates funds for the pilot program. (SB2571 HD1)
