A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state historic 2 preservation officer is the administrator of the state historic
- 3 preservation program. The state historic preservation officer's
- 4 duties include reviewing nominations for the National Register
- 5 of Historic Places and maintaining data on historic places in
- 6 Hawaii that have not yet been nominated for the National
- 7 Register of Historic Places. The state historic preservation
- 8 officer also serves as the State's consultant to federal
- 9 agencies during review regarding the federal Advisory Council on
- 10 Historic Preservation's regulations regarding the protection of
- 11 historic places. Federal agencies also consult with the state
- 12 historic preservation officer during their identification of
- 13 historic properties and their assessment of the effect of an
- 14 undertaking on a historic property.
- Due to the important role the state historic preservation
- 16 officer serves with regard to federal and state historic
- 17 preservation matters, the legislature in 1976 required the

- 1 Hawaii state historic preservation officer to be appointed on
- 2 the basis of professional competence and experience in the field
- 3 of historic preservation. The legislature finds that past and
- 4 present governors of the State of Hawaii have not appointed
- 5 Hawaii state historic preservation officers based on these
- 6 broadly worded qualifications and that basing this appointment
- 7 on nationally accepted and applied professional standards would
- 8 bring greater accountability and consistency to the appointment
- 9 of the Hawaii state historic preservation officer.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to clarify the professional
- 11 qualifications of the state historic preservation officer and
- 12 the deputy historic preservation officer.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 6E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] §6E-5[+] State historic preservation officer. (a)
- 16 The governor shall appoint a state historic preservation
- 17 officer, and may appoint the officer without regard to chapter
- 18 76, who shall be responsible for the comprehensive historic
- 19 preservation program and who shall be the state liaison officer
- 20 for the conduct of relations with the federal government and the
- 21 respective states with regard to matters of historic
- 22 preservation.
