A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 89C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides
- 2 appropriate authorities, including the board of education,
- 3 sufficient flexibility to adjust the wages, hours, benefits, and
- 4 other terms and conditions of employment for employees who are
- 5 excluded from collective bargaining. Under the law, these
- 6 appropriate authorities cannot adjust the wages and other
- 7 benefits that are set by statute.
- 8 Within the department of education, substitute teachers are
- 9 part-time, casual, and intermittent employees who are excluded
- 10 from collective bargaining.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to provide and appropriate funds
- 12 for periodic wage adjustments for substitute teachers that are
- 13 comparable to the wage adjustments negotiated for teachers in
- 14 bargaining unit 5 and to enable the board of education to adjust
- 15 the hours, benefits, and other terms and conditions of
- 16 employment for substitute teachers.

1	SECT	ION 2. Section 302A-624, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

3	"§30	2A-624 Teachers' salary schedule. (a) The salary		
4	schedule	for all teachers of the department [of education] shall		
5	be negotiated pursuant to section 89-9.			
6	(b)	All teachers [must] shall meet the following		
7	requirements:			
8	(1)	1) A teacher [must] shall earn at least five credits		
9		within a three-year cycle [in order] to receive		
10	increment or longevity step increases in the third			
11		year of the three-year cycle;		
12	(2)	(2) A teacher who fails to meet the requirement set forth		
13	in paragraph (1) shall not be eligible for any			
14	increment or longevity step increases until the			
15		teacher earns the credit requirement for the three-		
16		year cycle;		
17	(3)	Any credit earned in excess of any three-year credit		
18	requirement may not be carried over beyond the three-			
19		year cycle; and		
20	(4)	Credits earned $[\frac{\text{can}}]$ $\underline{\text{may}}$ be in the form of in-service,		
21		university, or other credits approved by the		
22		department.		

1	(c) A teacher [is] shall be required to spend at least one				
2	year in Class III before going on to Class IV, at least one year				
3	in Class IV before going on to Class V, at least one year in				
4	Class V before going on to Class VI, and at least one year in				
5	Class VI before going on to Class VII.				
6	(d) In case of promotion from a teaching position to an				
7	educational officer, the employee shall receive compensation at				
8	the lowest step of the higher grade that exceeds the employee's				
9	existing compensation by at least eight per cent if such a step				
10	exists.				
11	(e) Effective July 1, 2006, the minimum hourly or minimum				
12	per diem rate for substitute teachers shall be determined by th				
13	legislature as follows; provided that any individual in class I				
14	II, or III who works less than a full seven-hour work day shall				
15	be compensated on a pro-rated, hourly basis:				
16	(1) Class I: other individuals who do not possess a				
17	bachelor's degree shall be compensated at a rate of				
18	not less than \$125 for a full work day;				
10	(2) Class II. individuals with a bacholor's dogree shall				

be compensated at a rate of not less than \$136 for a

full work day; and

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1	(3) Class III: department of education to	eachers, or		
2	licensed or highly qualified teachers	, shall be		
3	compensated at a rate of not less than	ı \$147 for a full		
4	work day.			
5	(f) Effective July 1, 2008, the board shall	ll provide wage		
6	adjustments for substitute teachers. The wage adjustments shal			
7	be comparable to the across-the-board wage adjustments for			
8	teachers that are negotiated with bargaining unit 5. The board			
9	may also adjust hours, benefits, and other terms and conditions			
10	of employment for substitute teachers, subject to legislative			
11	approval, pursuant to section 89C-5."			
12	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general			
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$	or so		
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for			
15	the wage adjustments provided pursuant to this Act.			
16	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department o			
17	education for the purposes of this Act.
