## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PARI
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, since July 2002,
3	the Hawaii teacher standards board has been licensing teachers
4	and approving teacher preparation programs. The Hawaii teacher
5	standards board has worked in collaboration with teacher
6	preparation programs, schools, agencies, and the department of
7	education to improve the quantity and quality of teachers in the
8	state, as well as the quantity and quality of necessary and
9	relevant data that is accessible to all parties.
10	In 2007, the confirmation process for nominations to the
11	Hawaii teacher standards board became an issue. Questions
12	regarding the appropriate entities to make recommendations to
13	the governor under the law and specifying or clarifying those
14	constituencies to be represented, including their size, require
15	the legislature's attention to ensure effective operations of
16	the Hawaii teacher standards board through proper representation
17	of interested parties. Efforts to refine the current system

- 1 have been undertaken through a collaborative effort by the
- 2 interested parties, including the Hawaii teacher standards
- 3 board.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to make necessary changes to the
- 5 membership and nomination process for, provide necessary funding
- 6 for increased information accessibility for, and increase the
- 7 accountability of the Hawaii teacher standards board.
- 8 PART II
- 9 SECTION 2. The purpose of this part is to:
- 10 (1) Increase the number of teaching professionals on the
- Hawaii teacher standards board;
- 12 (2) Define "teachers regularly engaged in teaching"; and
- 13 (3) Clarify those organizations that may nominate
- 14 candidates for membership on the Hawaii teacher
- 15 standards board.
- 16 SECTION 3. Section 302A-801, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- 18 "(a) There is established the Hawaii teacher standards
- 19 board, which shall be placed within the department for
- 20 administrative purposes only. The board shall consist of
- 21 [thirteen] fourteen members, including not [less] fewer than
- 22 [six] seven licensed teachers regularly engaged in teaching,

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1	three educational officers, the chairperson of the board of		
2	education or the chairperson's designee, the superintendent or		
3	the superintendent's designee, a representative of independent		
4	schools, and the dean of the University of Hawaii college of		
5	education or the dean's designee; provided that the dean's		
6	designee shall be chosen from the member institutions of the		
7	teacher education coordinating committee established under		
8	section [+]304A-1202[+]. For purposes of this subsection,		
9	"teachers regularly engaged in teaching" means teachers, school		
10	counselors, or school librarians who are not assigned the duties		
11	of a school administrator.		
12	(b) Except for the chairperson of the board of education,		
13	the superintendent, and the dean of the college of education,		
14	the governor shall appoint the members of the board pursuant to		
15	section 26-34, from a list of qualified nominees submitted to		
16	the governor by [the departments, agencies, and organizations		
17	representative of the constituencies of the board.		
18	(1) The exclusive representative for public school		
19	teachers;		
20	(2) The exclusive representative for public school		
21	administrators;		

. 1	(3)	Any state chapter of a national professional	
2		organization that represents teachers or school	
3		administrators; and	
4	(4)	The Hawaii Association of Independent Schools for	
5		<pre>private school teachers.</pre>	
6	To the ex	tent possible, the board membership shall reflect	
7	representation of elementary and secondary school personnel from		
8	[all islands.] Oahu and the neighbor islands approximating the		
9	proportion of teachers and administrators who work in these		
10	areas. The teacher members of the Hawaii teacher standards		
11	board shall hold licenses representative of the range of subject		
12	matter and levels (elementary, middle, and high school) taught		
13	in public schools. The school administrator members of the		
14	Hawaii teacher standards board shall be administrators assigned		
15	to elemen	tary, middle, and high schools."	
16		PART III	
17	SECT	ION 4. Over the past several years, the board has been	
18	developing an electronic licensing system that has the		
19	capability of interfacing with public and private Hawaii teacher		
20	education	institutions and the department of education to share	
21	informati	on about licensed teachers. The system also has the	
22	capacity	to receive data from these same institutions and	
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- 1 agencies in a new way that expedites operations, as well as
- 2 avoids the need for duplicative collection of data by multiple
- 3 institutions and agencies. This sharing of information will
- 4 enable all parties to expedite the performance of their duties
- 5 and responsibilities.
- 6 The data-sharing effort has three facets:
- 7 (1) Technology;
- **8** (2) Functionality; and
- 9 (3) Project management and coordination.
- 10 The Hawaii teacher standards board and partner agencies are
- 11 directed to determine a mutually acceptable data transfer method
- 12 for the data to be exchanged.
- 13 The legislature further finds that, over the next several
- 14 months, the participating organizations will work to agree on
- 15 the list of transactions that each will be prepared to service
- 16 and originate. These transactions shall include all information
- 17 that each participating institution or agency, including the
- 18 department of education, stores in its automated system that may
- 19 support teacher licensing, re-licensing, teacher education, and
- 20 hiring, including but not limited to license information for any
- 21 current licensees, license application information for any
- 22 applicant, state-approved teacher education program completion



- 1 information, university course completion information for any
- 2 licensee, higher education degree information, teacher
- 3 employment and work site information, and teacher termination,
- 4 resignation, retirement, and leave status.
- 5 The purpose of this part, based on the support of the
- 6 teacher education coordinating committee, is to authorize the
- 7 Hawaii teacher standards board to coordinate an effort to create
- 8 a network incorporating the teacher education institutions and
- 9 the department of education to support the free interchange of
- 10 information valuable to all of the participating organizations.
- 11 Further, it is the purpose of this part to provide funds to
- 12 achieve this interchange.
- 13 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 16 the purposes of this part; provided that:
- 17 (1) An assessment of available internal resources and
- 18 additional resources required shall be used to
- 19 determine the funding needed to implement this part;
- **20** and
- 21 (2) In consultation with the participating organizations,
- the Hawaii teacher standards board shall use and

1	disburse the funds to the network partners in a manner
2	that responds to the organizations' needs and
3	circumstances while aiming to meet the purposes of
4	this part.
5	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
6	teacher standards board for the purposes of this part.
7	PART IV
8	SECTION 6. The purpose of this part is to increase
9	accountability and expand the scope of the information provided
10	by the Hawaii teacher standards board to the legislature and the
11	governor to include information on income and expenditures and
12	to require a summary report with data from the previous five
13	years of the Hawaii teacher standards board's accomplishments
14	and objectives, efforts to improve and maintain teacher quality,
15	and efforts to keep its operations responsive and efficient.
16	SECTION 7. Section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
18	"(a) In addition to establishing standards for the
19	issuance and renewal of licenses and any other powers and duties
20	authorized by law, the board's powers shall also include:
21	(1) Setting and administering its own budget;

1	(2)	Adopting, amending, or repealing the rules of the
2		board in accordance with chapter 91;
3	(3)	Receiving grants or donations from private
4		foundations, and state and federal funds;
5	(4)	Submitting an annual report to the governor and the
6		legislature on the board's operations, including
7		income and expenditures, and [from the 2007-2008
8		school year, submitting] a summary report [every] with
9		data from the previous five years of the board's
10		accomplishment of objectives, efforts to improve or
11		maintain teacher quality, and efforts to keep its
12		operations responsive and efficient;
13	(5)	Conducting a cyclical review of standards and
14		suggesting revisions for their improvement;
15	(6)	Establishing licensing fees in accordance with chapter
16		91, including the collection of fees by means of
17		mandatory payroll deductions, which shall subsequently
18		be deposited into the state treasury and credited to
19	ä	the Hawaii teacher standards board special fund;
20	(7)	Establishing penalties in accordance with chapter 91;
21	(8)	Issuing, renewing, revoking, suspending, and

reinstating licenses;

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1	(9)	Reviewing reports from the department on individuals
2		hired on an emergency basis;
3	(10)	Applying licensing standards on a case-by-case basis
4		and conducting licensing evaluations;
5	(11)	Preparing and disseminating teacher licensing
6		information to schools and operational personnel;
7	(12)	Approving teacher preparation programs;
8	(13)	Administering reciprocity agreements with other states
9		relative to licensing;
10	(14)	Conducting research and development on teacher
11		licensure systems, beginning teacher programs, the
12		assessment of teaching skills, and other related
13		topics;
14	(15)	Participating in efforts relating to teacher quality
15		issues, conducting professional development related to
16		the board's standards, and promotion of high teacher
17		standards and accomplished teaching; and
18	(16)	Adopting applicable rules and procedures."

20	SECT	ION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
21	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.

- 1 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
- 2 provided that section 5 shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
- 3 provided further that the amendments made to section
- 4 302A-803(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, in section 7 of this Act,
- 5 shall not be repealed when that section is reenacted on July 1,
- 6 2009, pursuant to section 4 of Act 263, Session Laws of Hawaii
- **7** 2007.
