A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC CONTRACTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 103D-701, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§103D-701 Authority to resolve protested solicitations 4 and awards. (a) Any actual or prospective bidder, offeror, or 5 contractor who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation 6 or award of a contract may protest to the chief procurement 7 officer or a designee as specified in the solicitation. Except 8 as provided in sections 103D-303 and 103D-304, a protest shall 9 be submitted in writing within [five] seven working days after 10 the aggrieved person knows or should have known of the facts 11 giving rise thereto; provided that a protest of an award or 12 proposed award shall in any event be submitted in writing within 13 [five] seven working days after the posting of award of the 14 contract under section 103D-302 or 103D-303, if no request for 15 debriefing has been made, as applicable; provided further that 16 no protest based upon the content of the solicitation shall be

1	considere	d unless it is submitted in writing prior to the date
2	set for t	he receipt of offers.
3	(b)	The purchasing agency shall notify in writing all
4	offerors	that solicited an award of a contract of their non-
5	selection	not later than the day of the posting of the award.
6	Informati	on posted publicly about the award shall include, where
7	applicabl	e, but is not limited to:
8	(1)	The names of offerors soliciting an award of the
9		<pre>contract;</pre>
10	(2)	The numerical scores given by the evaluation committee
11		to the acceptable and potentially acceptable
12		proposals, and if a best and final offer was
13		requested, the names of the priority-listed offerors
14		and their final numerical scores;
15	(3)	The name of the successful offeror and dollar amount
16		of the award; and
17	(4)	The basis for making the award to the successful
18		offeror; provided that trade secrets or other
19		proprietary or confidential information shall not be
20		disclosed.
21	[-(b) -	(c) The chief procurement officer or a designee,
22	prior to	the commencement of an administrative proceeding under

- 1 section 103D-709 or an action in court pursuant to section
- 2 103D-710, may settle and resolve a protest concerning the
- 3 solicitation or award of a contract. This authority shall be
- 4 exercised in accordance with rules adopted by the policy board.
- 5 [(c)] (d) If the protest is not resolved by mutual
- 6 agreement, the chief procurement officer or a designee shall
- 7 promptly issue a decision in writing to uphold or deny the
- 8 protest. The decision shall:
- 9 (1) State the reasons for the action taken; and
- 10 (2) Inform the protestor of the protestor's right to an
- 11 administrative proceeding as provided in this part, if
- 12 applicable.
- [$\frac{d}{d}$] (e) A copy of the decision under subsection [$\frac{d}{d}$]
- 14 (d) shall be mailed or otherwise furnished immediately to the
- 15 protestor and any other party intervening.
- 16 $\left[\frac{(e)}{(e)}\right]$ (f) A decision under subsection $\left[\frac{(e)}{(e)}\right]$ (d) shall be
- 17 final and conclusive, unless any person adversely affected by
- 18 the decision commences an administrative proceeding under
- 19 section 103D-709.
- 20 $[\frac{f}{g}]$ (g) In the event of a timely protest under
- 21 subsection (a), no further action shall be taken on the
- 22 solicitation or the award of the contract until the chief

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- 1 procurement officer makes a written determination that the award
- 2 of the contract without delay is necessary to protect
- 3 substantial interests of the State.
- 4 [(g)] (h) In addition to any other relief, when a protest
- 5 is sustained and the protestor should have been awarded the
- 6 contract under the solicitation but is not, then the protestor
- 7 shall be entitled to the actual costs reasonably incurred in
- 8 connection with the solicitation, including bid or proposal
- 9 preparation costs but not attorney's fees."
- 10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Requires purchasing agencies no later than the day a public contract award is posted, to notify offerors in writing of their non-selection, and to post information about the award and basis for the award; Increases the time for protesting an award from five to seven days of its posting. (SB2827 HD1)
