## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD ABANDONMENT.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECI	CION 1	. Section 709-902, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:		
3	"§70	9-902	Abandonment of a child. (1) A person commits
4	the offense of abandonment of a child if, being a parent,		
5	guardian, or other person legally charged with the care or		
6	custody of a child less than fourteen years old, the person		
7	[ <del>deserts</del> ]:		
8	<u>(a)</u>	Dese	rts the child in any place with intent to abandon
9		it[-	] <u>; or</u>
10	(b)	Leav	es the child with another person knowing that:
11		<u>(i)</u>	The person cannot prove the other person's
12			identity through official records such as a birth
13			certificate, school diploma, court documents,
14			employment applications, Social Security records,
15			or documents proving next of kin; or
16		(ii)	The person subsequently will not able to locate
17			or find the other person."

- 1 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun, before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

## Description:

Makes it a misdemeanor to abandon a child by leaving the child with a person knowing that the person's existence cannot be confirmed or the person cannot be found. Effective 7/1/2050. (SB2886 HD2)
