The auditor shall conduct a financial ement audit of the wireless enhanced 911 fund to ollowing issues:

  - (2) Whether the statutory authority to reimburse the public safety answering points and the wireless service providers for costs incurred to deploy wireless enhanced 911 services includes, or should include:

8	including any proposed legislation and identifying alternative
9	forms of funding concerning how the wireless enhanced 911 fund
10	has been managed and the moneys in the fund are expended.
11	SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on June 29, 2008.
