A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRUISE SHIPS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 342B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3	to read as follows:
4	"PART . AIR POLLUTION FROM COMMERCIAL PASSENGER VESSELS
5	§342B-A Definitions. As used in this part:
6	"Commercial passenger vessel" means a vessel that carries
7	passengers for hire. The term does not include a vessel:
8	(1) Authorized to carry fewer than fifty passengers;
9	(2) That does not provide overnight accommodations for at
10	least fifty passengers for hire, determined with
11	reference to the number of lower berths and based on
12	an average of two persons per cabin; or
13	(3) Operated by the United States or a foreign government
14	"Large commercial passenger vessel" means a commercial
15	passenger vessel that provides overnight accommodations for two
16	hundred fifty or more passengers for hire, determined with
17	reference to the number of lower berths and based on an average
18	of two persons per cabin.

- 1 "Marine waters of the state" means those waters between the
- 2 shoreline of the State of Hawaii and any point three nautical
- 3 miles from the shoreline of the state.
- 4 "Passengers for hire" means vessel passengers for whom
- 5 consideration is contributed as a condition of carriage on the
- 6 vessel, whether directly or indirectly flowing to the owner,
- 7 charterer, operator, agent, or any other person having an
- 8 interest in the vessel.
- 9 "Small commercial passenger vessel" means a commercial
- 10 passenger vessel that provides overnight accommodations for two
- 11 hundred forty-nine or fewer passengers for hire, determined with
- 12 reference to the number of lower berths and based on an average
- 13 of two persons per cabin.
- 14 "Vessel" means any form or manner of watercraft, other than
- 15 a seaplane on the water, whether or not capable of self-
- 16 propulsion.
- 17 "Voyage" means a vessel trip to or from one or more ports
- 18 of call in the state with the majority of the passengers for
- 19 hire completing the entire vessel trip. A vessel trip involving
- 20 stops at more than one port of call is considered a single
- 21 voyage so long as the majority of passengers for hire complete
- 22 the entire trip.

1	§342	B-B Prohibited air pollution. (a) No person shall
2	operate a	n incinerator of a large commercial passenger vessel in
3	any Hawai	ian port for the combustion of any waste materials,
4	except fo	r testing purposes as requested by the United States
5	Coast Gua	rd, the department, or their duly authorized
6	represent	atives.
7	(b)	Except as provided under section 342B-G, large
8	commercia	l passenger vessels shall limit visible emissions,
9	excluding	condensed water vapor, to no more than twenty per cent
10	opacity f	or periods of time exceeding six minutes in any
11	sixty-min	ute period except for the following:
12	(1)	When the ship is maneuvering to or from the dock or
13		anchor;
14	(2)	In the event of a navigational or safety concern on
15		the ship; or
16	(3)	In the event of an equipment failure; provided that
17		the owner or operator of a commercial passenger vessel
18		shall provide notice to the department within seventy-
19		two hours of the equipment failure and shall, upon
20		request, provide information to the department that
21		describes the subject equipment, malfunction,

1	corrective actions taken, and the start and end times
2	of the malfunctioning period.
3	§342B-C Information-gathering requirements. (a) Except
4	as provided under section 342B-I, the owner or operator of a
5	commercial passenger vessel shall maintain records and, upon
6	request of the department, provide to the department a report,
7	with copies of the records related to the period of operation in
8	the marine waters of the state, detailing the dates, times, and
9	locations, and the opacity of air emissions. While operating in
10	the marine waters of the state, all commercial passenger
11	vessels' stack exhaust plumes shall be monitored by a
12	transmissometer, or by an alternative methodology as approved by
13	the director.
14	(b) If the owner or operator of a commercial passenger
15	vessel, when complying with another state or federal law that
16	requires substantially equivalent information gathering, has
17	gathered the type of information required under subsection (a),
18	the owner or operator shall be considered to be in compliance
19	with that subsection so long as the information is also provided
20	to the department. The department shall establish, by rule,
21	requirements for determining substantially equivalent
22	information gathering.

- 1 §342B-D Recordkeeping requirements. An owner or operator
- 2 subject to section 342B-C shall record the information required
- 3 to be gathered under that section and shall maintain the records
- 4 for three years after the date the information was gathered.
- 5 §342B-E Reporting requirements. (a) An owner or operator
- 6 of a commercial passenger vessel who becomes aware of an air
- 7 emission in violation of section 342B-B shall immediately report
- 8 that air emission to the department. The report shall not be
- 9 deemed to be privileged information.
- 10 (b) If the owner or operator of a commercial passenger
- 11 vessel operating in the marine waters of the state is required
- 12 by the administrator of the United States Environmental
- 13 Protection Agency or the secretary of the federal department in
- 14 which the United States Coast Guard is operating to collect
- 15 samples and test the opacity of air emissions and keep records
- 16 of the sampling and testing, then the owner or operator, within
- 17 twenty-one days after the opacity of air emissions is tested,
- 18 shall submit to the department a copy of the records.
- (c) Upon request of the department, the information
- 20 required under this section shall be submitted electronically.

- 4 (e) The requirements of this section shall be subject to
- 5 alternative terms and conditions established under section
- 6 342B-I.
- 7 §342B-F Memorandum of understanding; recognition program.
- 8 (a) Nothing contained in this part shall prevent the State
- 9 from:
- 10 (1) Entering into voluntary agreements with any owners or
 11 operators of commercial passenger vessels, or their
 12 representatives, for the purpose of controlling
 13 pollution outside the marine waters of the state; or
- 14 (2) Adopting pollution controls more stringent than those contained in this part.
- 16 (b) The department may engage in efforts to encourage and 17 recognize superior environmental protection efforts made by the 18 owners or operators of commercial passenger vessels that exceed 19 the requirements established by law.
- 20 §342B-G Exemption for vessels in innocent passage. This 21 part shall not apply to a commercial passenger vessel that
- operates in the marine waters of the state solely in innocent

- 1 passage. For purposes of this section, a vessel is engaged in
- 2 innocent passage if its operation in marine waters of the state,
- 3 regardless of whether the vessel is a United States or foreign-
- 4 flag vessel, would constitute innocent passage under the United
- 5 Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea 1982, December 10,
- 6 1982, United Nations Publication No. E.83.V.5, 21 I.L.M. 1261
- 7 (1982), were the vessel a foreign-flag vessel.
- 8 §342B-H Activities of the department. The department may
- 9 engage in the following activities relating to commercial
- 10 passenger vessels operating in the marine waters of the state:
- 11 (1) Direct monitoring of the opacity of air emissions from
- those vessels;
- 13 (2) Monitoring and studying of direct or indirect
- 14 environmental effects of those vessels; and
- 15 (3) Researching ways to reduce effects of those vessels on
- 16 marine waters and other coastal resources.

17 §342B-I Alternative terms and conditions of vessel

- 18 discharges. (a) The department may establish alternative terms
- 19 and conditions of vessel air pollution applicable to an owner or
- 20 operator of a vessel who cannot practicably comply with the
- 21 standard terms and conditions of vessel air pollution under
- 22 sections 342B-B, 342B-C, 342B-D, and 342B-E or who wishes to use

1	or test a	rternative environmental protection equipment of
2	procedure	s. Except as specified in alternative terms and
3	condition	s set by the department under this subsection, the
4	alternati	ve terms and conditions of vessel air pollution shall
5	require c	ompliance with the standard terms and conditions of
6	vessel ai	r pollution under sections 342B-B, 342B-C, 342B-D, and
7	342B-E.	The department, on a case-by-case basis, may set
8	alternati	ve terms and conditions of vessel air pollution if:
9	(1)	The vessel owner or operator demonstrates to the
10		department's reasonable satisfaction that equivalent
11		environmental protection can be attained through other
12	x	terms or conditions appropriate for the specific
13		configuration or operation of the vessel;
14	(2)	The vessel owner or operator agrees to make necessary
15		changes to the vessel to allow it to comply with the
16		standard terms and conditions of vessel air pollution
17		under sections 342B-B, 342B-C, 342B-D, and 342B-E, but
18		demonstrates to the department's reasonable
19		satisfaction that additional time is needed to make
20		the necessary changes; or
21	(3)	An experimental technology or method for pollution
22		control of air pollution is being used or is proposed

1	as one of the alternative terms and conditions of
2	vessel air pollution, and the department determines
3	that the experimental technology or method has a
4	reasonable likelihood of success in providing
5	increased protection for the environment.
6	(b) Alternative terms and conditions of vessel air
7	pollution approved by the department under subsection (a), if
8	determined appropriate by the department, may include a waiver
9	by the department of portions of the requirements of sections
10	342B-B, 342B-C, and 342B-D for the time period that the
11	department determines to be appropriate."
12	SECTION 2. Section 342D-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended as follows:
14	1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
15	"(a) Except as provided under section 342D-111, the owner
16	or operator of a commercial passenger vessel shall maintain
17	records and, upon request of the department, provide to the
18	department a report, with copies of the records related to the
19	period of operation in the marine waters of the State, detailing
20	the dates, times, and locations, and the volumes or flow-rates
21	of any discharge of sewage or other wastewater into the marine

waters of the State[, or the opacity of air emissions]."

10	SECTION 5. Section 342D-111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended to read as follows:
12	"[+]§342D-111[+] Alternative terms and conditions of
13	vessel discharges. (a) The department may establish
14	alternative terms and conditions of vessel discharges applicable
15	to an owner or operator of a vessel who cannot practicably
16	comply with the standard terms and conditions of vessel
17	discharges under sections 342D-102, $[342D-103,]$ 342D-104, and
18	342D-106 or who wishes to use or test alternative environmental
19	protection equipment or procedures. Except as specified in
20	alternative terms and conditions set by the department under
21	this subsection, the alternative terms and conditions of vessel

- terms and conditions of vessel discharges under sections 1
- 342D-102, $[\frac{342D-103}{1}]$ 342D-104, and 342D-106. The department, 2
- on a case-by-case basis, may set alternative terms and 3
- conditions of vessel discharges if: 4
- 5 The vessel owner or operator demonstrates to the (1)department's reasonable satisfaction that equivalent 6 7 environmental protection can be attained through other 8 terms or conditions appropriate for the specific 9 configuration or operation of the vessel;
- (2) The vessel owner or operator agrees to make necessary changes to the vessel to allow it to comply with the standard terms and conditions of vessel discharges under sections 342D-102, [342D-103] 342D-104, and 342D-106 but demonstrates to the department's 14 reasonable satisfaction that additional time is needed to make the necessary changes; or
 - An experimental technology or method for pollution (3)control of a discharge is being used or is proposed as one of the alternative terms and conditions of vessel discharges, and the department determines that the experimental technology or method has a reasonable

3	(b) Alternative terms and conditions of vessel discharges
4	approved by the department under subsection (a), if determined
5	appropriate by the department, may include a waiver by the
6	department of portions of the requirements of sections
7	342D-102[, $342D-103$, $]$ and $342D-104$ for the time period that the
8	department determines to be appropriate."
9	SECTION 6. Section 342D-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	repealed.
11	["[§342D-103] Prohibited air emissions. (a) No person
12	shall operate an incinerator of a large commercial passenger
13	vessel in any Hawaiian port for the combustion of any waste
14	materials.
15	(b) Except as provided under section 342D-106, large
16	commercial passenger vessels shall limit visible emissions,
17	excluding condensed water vapor, to no more than twenty per cent
18	opacity for periods of time exceeding six minutes in any sixty
19	minute period except for the following:
20	(1) When the ship is maneuvering to or from the dock or
21	anchor;

1	(2) In the event of a navigational or safety concern on
2	the ship; or
3	(3) In the event of an equipment failure; provided that
4	the cruise line shall upon request, provide
5	information to the department that describes the
6	subject equipment, malfunction, corrective actions
7	taken, and the start and end times of the
8	<pre>malfunctioning period."]</pre>
9	SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11	begun, before its effective date.
12	SECTION 8. If any provision of this Act, or the
13	application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
14	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
15	applications of the Act, that can be given effect without the
16	invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions
17	of this Act are severable.
18	SECTION 9. In codifying the new sections added to chapter
19	342B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by section 1 of this Act, the
20	revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers
21	for the letters used in the designations of and references to
22	those new sections in this Act.

- 1 SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.

Transfers the cruise ship air emission provisions from the Water Pollution Law to the Air Pollution Control Law. (SB3082 HD1)
