# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LAND CONSERVATION FUND.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 173A-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$173A-4 Authority to acquire and convey. (a) In
4 consultation with the senate president and speaker of the house
5 of representatives, the board may acquire, by purchase, gift, or
6 the exercise of the power of eminent domain as authorized by
7 chapter 101, any land having value as a resource to the State.
8 Such acquisition is hereby declared to be for a public use.

9 The board may, subject to chapter 171, in consultation (b) 10 with the senate president and speaker of the house of 11 representatives, and with the approval of the governor, sell, 12 lease, or otherwise convey any such land subject to terms and 13 conditions that it deems appropriate and that will ensure that 14 the transferee shall not use the land in a manner that is inconsistent with the purposes for which it was acquired by the 15 board. The terms and conditions shall run with the land and 16 shall be binding on the transferee's heirs, successors, and 17
